- DURING THIS INSPECTION, A LARGE DUMPSTER ADJACENT TO THE BATESON'S BAY AND TRAINING POOL AREAS WAS EMPTIED INTO A WASTE DISPOSAL TRUCK. AS THE DUMPSTER WAS INVERTED, A LARGE AMOUNT OF DUST, DIRT AND PAPER RUBBISH WAS PICKED UP BY THE WIND AND BLOWN AWAY. IT WAS NOTED BY THE STAFF THAT THIS WINDBLOWN DIRT/RUBBISH OFTEN ENDS UP IN THE DOLPHIN POOLS (PARTICULARLY BATESON'S BAY) WHICH NECESSITATES REMOVAL. WASTE DISPOSAL MUST BE PROVIDED AND OPERATED IN SUCH A WAY TO MINIMIZE HAZARD TO THE ANIMALS. RELOCATING THIS DUMPSTER AWAY FROM THE POOL AREAS WOULD ALLEVIATE THIS PROBLEM. CORRECT BY 16 JUNE 1994.

23. **SHELTER FROM ELEMENTS (3.103)(b) - AMIKO, AN ADULT MALE TURSIOPS TRUNCATUS, WAS OBSERVED STATIONING FOR PROLONGED PERIODS OF TIME. BECAUSE HE WAS NOT SUBMERGING OFTEN ENOUGH TO KEEP HIS MELON WET, HE HAD BECOME QUITE SUNBURNED JUST POSTERIOR TO HIS BLOW HOLE - RESULTING IN AREAS OF PEELING SKIN. THE STAFF HAD RESPONDED TO THIS BEHAVIOR BY APPLYING SUNBLOCK TO HIS HEAD THROUGHOUT THE DAY, WHICH HELPED BUT DID NOT ELIMINATE THE SUNBURN. WHEN I ASKED WHY HE DID NOT HAVE A TARPULIN OR SHADECLOTH TO PROVIDE SHADE, I WAS TOLD THAT IT HAD ALREADY BEEN REQUESTED 1-2 WEEKS AGO, BUT HAD NOT YET BEEN PUT IN PLACE. SHELTER APPROPRIATE TO THE INDIVIDUAL ANIMAL AND SPECIES MUST BE PROVIDED FOR MARINE MAMMALS TO PROTECT THEM FROM DIRECT SUNLIGHT. A SHADECLOTH WAS HUNG OVER ONE END OF AMIKO'S TANK DURING THIS INSPECTION (OVER THE AREA WHERE HE CONTINUES TO STATION). THEREFORE, THIS NONCOMPLIANCE IS CONSIDERED CORRECTED.**
