This show is affiliated to the Highland Pony Society.

Ponies must be registered in the full body of the Highland Pony Society Stud Book (including appendices A, B & C). Some external qualifiers such as the NPS impose their own additional restrictions. All competing Highland pony stallions in affiliated shows (In Hand, Ridden, WHP etc) aged 4yrs and over must be licensed with the Highland Pony Society.

Class 4 **Highland Pony In Hand** - Mare, Stallion or Gelding, aged four years and over.

Class 5 **Highland Pony In Hand** - Colt, Filly or Gelding, aged up to and including 3 years'

Class 5 is a qualifier for the 2019 Highland Pony Society Youngstock Championships. The winner will qualify for the Highland Pony Youngstock Championships. Two Championships will be held; one at the Central Scotland Highland Pony Club Summer Show at Strathallan Castle on Sunday 1 September 2019 and one at the Rare Breeds of the Year Show at Arena UK, Grantham on Saturday 5 October 2019. The qualifying exhibitor can select which Championship Show they wish to enter. Exhibitors are not required to be members of the Highland Pony Society for qualifying classes. All those competing in the Championships must be members of the Society. Entry to the final is free. The Champions and Reserves will receive rosettes and prize money of £100 and £50 respectively and all those forward at the finals will receive £15 and a finalist rosette. A sash and perpetual trophy will be awarded to each of the Champions.

Class 6 **Novice Ridden Highland** – Ponies not to have won an open ridden class, Mare, Stallion, or gelding 4 years old and over – ponies will not be ridden by the Judge. Riders in this class should be suitably dressed

Class 7 **Open Ridden Highland** – Mare, Stallion, or gelding 4 years old and over – ponies will not be ridden by the Judge. Riders in this class should be suitably dressed

Handlers can wear either white or tweed.

Class 12: Open Horse/pony **Brood Mare** with Foal at Foot or due in 2018

Class 13: Open Horse/Pony **Foals** shown with their Dam. Foals need not be from the mare in previous class but must be accompanied by their dam in the ring.

Class 14: Open Horse/Pony **Yearling, Two, Three & Four Years Old Colt, Filly Mare or Gelding** to be shown in hand

If sufficient numbers forward the above class will be split.

#### Sports Horse/Pony/Hunter In Hand Championship 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> placed in Classes 12-14

## **RIDDEN HEAVY HORSES**

Class 15: **Open Ridden Heavy Horse** – Kilmannan Championship Equifest Qualifier - Open to horses 4 years old and over that are registered in the main British Stud Books of the Shire, Clydesdale, Suffolk or Percheron Society at the time of qualification and must be entered in the name and ownership they are registered.

Riders of Stallions must be 16 years or over.

The highest placed registered Shire, Clydesdale, Suffolk or Percheron in an affiliated ridden heavy horse class to qualify for the BRHHS Championship, qualification to go down no lower than third place and there has to be three horses forward in the ring for the qualification to be awarded.

Qualifiers are entitled to compete in the final of the Ridden Heavy Horse Championship to be held at Equifest on 31st August 2019. Subject to the show rules and conditions.

#### **RoR Jockey Club Novice Show Series Qualifier 2019**

Thoroughbred mare or gelding, 4years old or over, any height. Riders must be 15 years or over on the 1<sup>st</sup> January of the calendar year holding the classes. Horses should be ridden in a snaffle, pelham or simple double bridle with a plain cavasson noseband. Horses should be plaited.

To take part in this class, horses must NOT have won an – a ridden open class under any affiliated showing society including (inc SEIB/HOYS, BSHA, SHB(GB) BSPS, BSPA, RoR Tattersalls Show Series Qualifier, TARRA Ridden, RoR AMATEUR Ridden Show Series Qualifier or any other open class **except** RoR TBA Challenge Show Series or other Working Hunter type classes. Unaffiliated Show wins are not taken into account.

Horses **WILL** be ridden by the judge. Horses will be stripped for conformation.

**Horses may remain in RoR Jockey Club Novice Show Series classes until they have won (win) 3 RoR Jockey Club Novice Show Series Qualifiers. They are de-noviced on their third novice win or on the day they win an open class, whichever happens first. They are still eligible to compete in the RoR Jockey Club Final at the RoR Goffs UK National Championships that August. In August of the same year.**

**The first three go forward to the Final at the RoR Goffs Uk Championships, Aintree in August 2019 or 2020 for shows after 1<sup>st</sup> August 2019.** All entries **MUST** be have current RoR competition registration and have **RACED in GB**. The class will be run under the rules of RoR. All those entering horses and/or participating in the show agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force. Please be aware that the show will split the class on the horse's last run in a race (NH or Flat) should the entries exceed 20. Please mark your entry form accordingly. **Competitors must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap. Racing injuries and blemishes are NOT ignored in this series.**

Prizes - Rosette 1<sup>st</sup> -6<sup>th</sup> and Vouchers 1-4<sup>th</sup> : 1<sup>st</sup> £50 plus voucher for jacket, 2<sup>nd</sup> 25, 3<sup>rd</sup> £20, 4<sup>th</sup> £10.

#### **The RoR Tattersalls Scottish Show Series Qualifier 2019**

Thoroughbred mare or gelding, 4years old or over, any height. Riders must be 15 years or over on the 1st January of the calendar year holding the classes. Horses should be

ridden in a snaffle, pelham or simple double bridle with a plain cavesson noseband. Horses should be plaited. The first three go forward to the championship at the Royal Highland Show 2020. In the event that the first three are already qualified, the qualification will go down the line to fourth.

All entries **MUST** have current competition registration with the RoR and have **RACED** in GB. There will be a prize for the highest placed veteran 15 years or over. The class will be run under the rules of RoR. Horses to be ridden by the judge. All those entering horses and/or participating in the show agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force'

Competitors must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap.

Racing injuries and blemishes will **NOT** be ignored in this series

**Prizes** : Rosettes 1st to 6th place, Vouchers 1st to 4th place. Veteran prize, £25 voucher to be redeemed from RoR office and qualification for the Veteran final at Aintree  
1st £60 plus voucher for jacket, 2nd £40, 3rd £20, 4th £10

### **Unaffiliated Retraining Of Racehorse Working Hunter**

Mare or gelding 4yrs old or over and of any height. Riders must be 15 years old or over on the 1<sup>st</sup> January. Horses to be ridden in any suitable bridle and should be plaited. All entries need not be registered with RoR but should HAVE raced in GB. Racing injuries and blemishes ARE IGNORED in this series

Horses will NOT be ridden by the judge. Horses may be stripped for conformation at the discretion of the judge.

**Competitors must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap.** All those entering horses and/or participating in the show agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force'

The class to be judged **50%** jumping, **20%** Style while jumping and performance and **30%** awarded for show, manners and suitability to be retrained.

#### PHASE 1

Jumping to be judged:

8 rustic jumps (2' 6" to 3 foot with a maximum spread of 85 centimeters)

The following points to be deducted at the end of each jumping round:

10 points to be deducted for a knock down.

15 points to be deducted for a refusal.

20 points for second refusal.

Elimination for third refusal or fall

#### PHASE 2

Class returns without boots and judged for an individual show/conformation. (*In some classes, at the judge's discretion, horses might be asked to do a 'show' following their jumping without leaving the ring. This is often the case with a large number in the class*)

Each horse to complete an individual show of no longer than 1 ½ minutes. Show to include the following movements:

Walk, Trot, canter showing change of leg, extended canter (gallop) halt and stand, walk off on long rein. Total marks out of **30%** for Show, manners and suitability to be retrained.

## RING 3

### WORKING HUNTER Judging in Ring 3, Not before 11.00 am

Horses may compete in two classes but those competing in the Botanica/BHS Working Hunter Class may not compete in the Novice Class.

Class 22: **Novice Working Hunter over 15 hands.**

Jumps not exceeding 2'6". Horse & Rider combination not to have won 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> or over £10 in prize money in any in any WH or jumping Competition at this height or above

Class 23: **Open Working Hunter**, over 15 hands. Jumps not exceeding 3ft

Class 24: **Botanica/BHS Scotland Working Hunter Series 2019**, over 15 hands.  
Jumps not exceeding 3ft 6"

This class 24 is a qualifier for the Blair Castle International Horse Trials and Country Fair. The first three prize winners will qualify for the final of the Botanica/British Horse Society Working Hunter Series which will be held at Blair Castle in August 2019.

To be eligible for the final either the rider or the owner must be a member of the British Horse Society.

**The course:** At least 8 and not more than 12 fences, with changes of direction, must be set in a ring large enough to permit jumping fluently at a fair hunting pace. Fences should be rustic or as natural as possible, not easily dislodged, of solid appearance, well filled and with shrubs as wings. Maximum height 3ft 6ins (1.05m), maximum spread 3ft 9ins (1.12m), except open ditch and water. The course should be set at, or near, maximum unless the judge considers that the ground makes this unsafe. Normally at least one upright and one spread must be at maximum.

**Qualification:** The first THREE qualify for the final, even if they did not jump clear. If one of the first three has already qualified the qualifying card can be passed down to fourth place provided the 4th placed rider jumped clear. Only fully qualified combinations holding a Signed Qualifying Card for the current year may enter.

Please be aware of rule number 48 H which states: All ridden hunters must be shod all round. No pads or surgical shoes are allowed.

## **REGULATIONS FOR SHOW**

### **Implements etc: Stands**

- 1: All Implements etc must be on the Show Ground on Friday 28<sup>th</sup> June 2019 or by 8 am on 29<sup>th</sup> June 2019 and remain there until the close of the Show. A person will attend and maps will be available to position implements.  
All implements must be removed by 5pm Monday 1<sup>st</sup> July 2019.

### **Livestock Etc.**

- 1: Exhibitors by making entries shall undertake all Horses, Ponies, Sheep and Cattle entered by them shall be paraded by the times stated in the programme for the Show, and at any other time when required by the Stewards, and under their direction. Attendants should see that the animal's number is showing at all times. Infringement of this rule, or failure of any attendant to obey the orders of the Show Officials will render the Exhibitor liable to a fine of £25 for each separate infringement or act of disobedience, and to the forfeiture of any or all of the Prizes awarded to him at the Show. Persons making insulting remarks to, or in any way unduly interfering with the Judges, Stewards or other Officials while in the performance of their duties, and all Exhibitors or others in charge of Stock while in the Judging Rings refusing to accept or display Tickets, etc awarded by the Judges and handed to them by the Stewards or other Officials, or tearing up Tickets etc so awarded and handed to them, or of any similar conduct shall be considered guilty of misconduct, and shall be dealt with under these Rules. Exhibitors shall be answerable for all acts of their servants or others in charge of their stock, and shall be responsible for their animals during the whole time they remain in the Show Ground. The Society shall not be held responsible for any damage suffered by any Driver, Rider, Herd or Attendant or by any Animal, Implement or other Exhibit, in the Show Ground, or on the way to and from the Ground. The Stewards shall enforce the Regulations of the Society in their different departments, and shall bring to the notice of the Directors and Secretaries any infringement. All persons in Charge of Stock or other Exhibits shall be subject to the orders of the Secretaries and Stewards.
- 2: It is the responsibility of exhibitors that stock brought onto the show field by them or on their behalf is free from disease and under control at all times. The Society shall not be responsible for any illness, disease, injury or damage contracted or caused to stock, stock attendants, exhibitors or others connected with such stock on account of the state of health of or by any actions of any stock on the Show Ground. Cattle must have BVD negative status and tested free of disease. Cattle coming from TB areas or been purchased from these areas must be tested clear of TB during the 60 days before the arrival at the Show Ground and must have a certificate as conformation. All livestock susceptible to Bluetongue coming to the show must be fully protected by vaccination in line with current legislation and regulations. All exhibitors and others submitting entries shall be deemed to have accepted the terms of these rules.
- 3: BCMS cattle movements are the responsibility of the exhibitor for reporting onto and off Show Ground. Holding number labels will be supplied by show secretary on the day of show and all passports will be signed by Cattle Steward. All exhibitors must abide by the rules.
- 4: Entry money as stated must accompany entries.  
Members with eight entries will have subsequent entries charged at half price. Judges may withhold Second Prize where there are fewer than three exhibits forward.

- 5: All stock must be on the Show Ground on Saturday 29<sup>th</sup> June 2019, not later than 9am as judging commences at 9.00 am in the horse classes and 10 am in the cattle, sheep. Produce and craft, vintage and trade stands.
- 6: All stock competing for the Society's prizes must have been in the possession of the Exhibitor for one month previous to entry. In the horse classes the Horse name, Rider Name and age of rider to be stated on entry schedule.
- 7: All stock for competition must, at the date of entry be bona fide the property of and in possession of the party in whose name it is entered.
- 8: The ages of all animals are counted from 1st January in the year they were born e.g. a foal born any time in 2018 becomes a yearling as from 1st January 2019.
- 9: All intimations of Competition must be lodged with the Secretaries in writing, no later than 5 o'clock on 1st June 2019. No un-entered or improperly entered stock will, in the option of the Directors, be allowed to compete. All Entry Money must accompany the Entry Schedule in order to compete. Horse entries will be taken on the field at **until 2.00 pm only. Any new horse/rider combination wishing to enter on show day will require to pay double the entry fee. Any pre-entered horse/rider combination wishing to enter further classes on show day will NOT require to pay double the entry fee**
- 10: With the notes of intimation to compete, the names and Pedigrees, so far as known, of all Breeding Stock to be given in, and in all Entries of Cattle of any description the exact age must be stated. Registered Mountain & Moorland Ponies/Horses must have their registration number noted on their entry form.
- 11: All stock must on the day of competition be on the ground and must remain in Show Ground until 3pm. **One Attendant only admitted with each lot, they must attend in charge during the day.** Exhibitors, unless attending Stock are not entitled to Free Admission to the Show.
- 12: All prize money must be collected on Show Day.
- 13: Protests against awards of Judges must be lodged, in writing with the Secretaries, before 2 o'clock upon the day of the Show, or within 30 minutes of completion of judging of class. The Protestor must lodge his protest with a deposit of £20, which will be forfeited should his protest be unsuccessful.
- 14: All bulls must be shown with a ring in their nose, and rope and chain attached.
- 15: The Judges shall award commendation to any Animal brought for competition if they think they are worthy

Note:

It is to be understood, in regard to whole premiums, that the Committee shall have the power to withhold them if the stock shown is, in the opinion of the Judges, not considered of sufficient merit, or if the particular regulations for competition are not complied with. Any natural defect or lameness in the Breeding Stock will be disqualified. Judges are particularly requested to satisfy themselves, as far as possible, regarding the soundness of horses before awarding prizes, and to avoid giving a preference to animals showing symptoms of hereditary diseases. The Judges may consult the Society Veterinary Surgeon if they deem it expedient. No protest on veterinary grounds will be received.

- 16: The decision of the Directors shall, in the case of protests and in matters arising at or in connection with the Show be final, and any person present at the Show, whether a Judge, Exhibitor, Visitor, or otherwise shall be deemed to have agreed to refer the subject matter of such decisions to the final determination of the Directors to the exclusion of all courts of Law.
- 17: In the horse and pony classes, competitors may only ride/lead one horse or pony in the same class, with the exception of Working Hunter and Show Jumping classes.
18. As a competitor/exhibitor I understand that all activities I participate in at this event are taken at my own risk and accept all responsibility. As a competitor/exhibitor I agree not to bring any claim against the organisers of this event.
- 19: In stock classes the Overall Bonnington Cup for the highest number of points overall will be scored as 1st – 5 points, 2nd – 3 points, 3rd – 1 point, however if there are two or less exhibitors in each class then these classes will be scored as 1st – 3 points and 2nd – 1 point.
