

News and Updates Fr Joseph Muzquiz's Cause Advances



On May 22, Cardinal Sean O'Malley of Boston closed the Diocesan phase of the Process of Canonization for Fr Joseph. He was one of the first 3 ordained priests of Opus Dei. He was sent here to the United States by the founder of Opus Dei to begin the apostolic work of Opus Dei. All that he had with him to begin Opus Dei here in the US was a plane ticket and a picture of Our Lady. With dogged, cheerful determination, he was able to spread the spirit of Opus Dei.
