

THE TRAINING PROGRAM

You must be involved at least 30 hours of training per week, of which at least 70% is conducted in the workplace (as opposed to in a classroom). The program is a structured workplace-based training program that is specifically tailored to your training needs, you would be eligible for training visa after discussing your matter with our registered migration agent.

Up to 2 years paid Professional Development Program in Australia

REQUIREMENTS

As the applicant, you must:

- Graduate from the BSB60215 Advanced Diploma of Business at the Academy of Entrepreneurs
- Must be 18 years old or older
- Have a valid passport
- Prove your identity and show you have a sponsor or nomination invitation, financial support and health insurance.
- Be employed and received a Letter of Employment
- Have adequate arrangements for health insurance during your stay in Australia

BENEFITS

- Get paid Australian work experience of 30 or more hours per week
- Be paid rates and receive workplace conditions are set by Australian law
- Your minimum pay rate can come from an award, enterprise agreement or other registered agreement, or the national minimum wage. Employees have to be paid the right pay rate for all hours they work including training, team meetings, opening and closing the business and doing a trail shift.
- Visit Australia to complete a workplace-based training (to improve your skills for your current occupation or field of expertise), or a professional development training program

YOU MAY NOT

- Be over the age of 45
- Be employed and/or work at any other organisation in Australia
- Work less than 30hrs per week during this visa
