





Union Street was once an unpaved road which linked the developing city of San Francisco with the Presidio. Prominent San Franciscans settled here and erected impressive mansions in the 1860s and 1870s, built in the ornate Victorian style.


Lower Haight Merchants' mission is to support a safe, thriving and inclusive corridor.


