

Make sure the best groups get Title X grants: Serve as a grant application reviewer

Consider [applying](#) to be a grant reviewer for federal [Title X](#) family planning grant applications.

Peer reviewers are vital to this process because they assist the federal government in awarding funds to only the most qualified applicants.

You may submit your credentials for consideration as a peer reviewer for the Office of the Assistant Secretary for Health's Objective Review Committee (ORC).

Action: Go to <https://rrm.grantsolutions.gov/AgencyPortal/oash.aspx> to create your profile.

You will be asked to upload your résumé or curriculum vitae (CV) in addition to detailing your areas of expertise, experience and education. You must upload a résumé or CV in order to be considered to serve as a peer reviewer.

Once you've completed that step, also:

Action: Email your résumé or curriculum vitae, along with a brief explanation of your expertise and interest, to Freedom2Care – JI@Freedom2Care.org.

Federal program officers will review profiles in the system to identify those whose expertise best matches the needs of a particular grant program. If your profile matches those needs, then you may be contacted to serve as a peer reviewer. If you are not selected for an upcoming Objective Review Committee this year, your profile will remain active and you may be contacted in the future.

Serving as a peer reviewer is an equal opportunity experience. Non-federally employed individuals may receive monetary compensation for their participation on a review committee.
