Refunds will be considered after the closing date only on presentation of a medical and/or veterinary certificate.

- If a medical certificate for a vaulter is received an administration fee of \$50 will be retained by the Organising Committee.
- If a veterinary certificate is received and vaulters have not been able to find alternative horse spots an administration fee of \$50 per vaulter will be retained by the Organising Committee. There will be no stable refunds.

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CONDITIONS FOR CLASSES

The VNSW State Championships will be conducted in accordance with the current edition of EA Vaulting Rules 2018 and EA General Regulations.

The EA Vaulting rules and EA General Regulations are on the EA website <u>www.equestrian.org.au</u>

- Vaulters may enter one of each of the following:
 - o Individual Horse
 - Horse Squad Compulsories
 - Horse Squad Freestyle
 - o Barrel Squad
 - Pas de Deux Horse
 - Pas de Deux Barrel
- **Open Individual class**: include all 3 Open Tests which are averaged for the final score.
- Advanced Individual classes: will be run over TWO rounds for this event
- **Squads**: One reserve to be nominated and entered in the competition via Nominate.
- The reserve must be declared at the Team Managers Meeting or two hours prior to the start of the class.
- All other classes will be run over one round.
- Vaulting is an Inclusive sport.
 - All vaulters with a disability are encouraged to compete in the class that they feel most comfortable.
 - Athletes with a disability will need to indicate where appropriate on the Nominate entry form to be considered for the AWD prizes, which will be awarded within each agegroup.
- Pas de Deux A is for combinations previously scoring 6.0 or higher, in PDD classes
- Pas de Deux B is for combinations previously scoring under 6.0 in PDD classes.
- New PDD combinations are encouraged to start at the level best suited to their ability.
- Upon receipt of all entries per class, the O/C reserves the right to split classes.
- If the event is oversubscribed the O/C reserves the right to accept entries in order of receipt.

Horse Development and Lunger Classes:

Horse Development Class:

- The Horse Development class is offered at the start of the event.
- The horse and lunger will be allowed 3 minutes in the arena. Time will start after the trot round.
- Horses must show a minimum of two gaits and up to two vaulters may vault.
- This class will be judged with scores and comments but no placings will be allocated.
- Time constraints may govern the number of horses allowed to enter this class.
- This class may be offered every day. Each horse may only enter this class once daily.
- Horse points per entry 3.

Lunger Class (Walk or Canter):

- Lungers must nominate the horse to be lunged.
- Lunger must enter, salute, put the horse on a circle, trot a circle then walk or canter (depending on class entered) the horse for one minute, halt, salute and then exit.
- Lungers may have a person run in to assist with the whip.
- Horse points for class 40A will be 0.5 points.
- Horse points for class 40B will be 1 point.
- Judging will be based on the horse score component of FEI/AVR rules.

NOMINATE - 2 Entry Processes.

• Vaulter entry:

• This is the usual entry for vaulters to enter classes and select horse and lunger combinations via Nominate.

• <u>Club pre-entry</u>:

- This system is to register a new club, squad, horse and lunger details with Nominate and must be submitted prior to Nominate opening for Vaulter entries. It will also be used for any amendments needed:
 - Adjustments & additions to horses & lunger information
 - Adjustments & additions to squad and club names
 - If you are not entering as a competitor and wish to receive competition information via email please register here (teammanagers, lungers, volunteers not already entered)
 - No money transfer will be necessary
 - Please allow 48 hours for horse details to be added to the database for vaulters to select when placing their entries.

STATE AWARDS:

The Organizing Committee would like to express appreciation to ENSW for its continued support.

Eligibility:

VNSW welcomes participation by Interstate vaulters. Interstate vaulters will receive class placing awards but only ENSW members will be eligible for State Champion awards.

<u>Prizes:</u>

- Medallions for 1st place in all horse classes
- Ribbons 2nd to 6th place for all horse classes.
- Ribbons 1st to 6th place for barrel classes.

Individual Vaulter Awards:

State Champion Individual Trophies will be awarded to the highest placed NSW vaulter from the highest individual class in the following age groups.

- Under 13 years
- 13 years to 17 years
- 18 years and over

State AWD Champion Individual Trophies will be awarded to the highest placed NSW vaulter from the highest individual class in the following age groups.

- Under 13 years
- 13 years to 17 years
- 18 years and over

Pas De Deux Award:

Pas De Deux state champions will be the NSW combination that has the highest score from the highest class – Preliminary, Intermediate or Open.

Squad Award:

Squad state champions will be the NSW squad that has the highest score from the **Compulsories** from the highest class – Preliminary, Novice or Advanced.

Horse & Lunger Combination Awards:

Best Individual Vaulting Horse & Lunger Combination of the Championships:

The best NSW Individual Vaulting Horse & Lunger Combination of the Championships receives a rug donated by Equestrian NSW.

Criteria for this award:

This award will be based on horse scores from the Intermediate, Advanced and Open Individual classes. It will be awarded to the highest final horse score achieved by a NSW combination. In order to achieve a 'final horse score' the horse scores for specific Individual vaulters are averaged to give a 'final horse score' (i.e. on a per Individual vaulter basis).

Best NSW Pdd Horse & Lunger Combination of the Championships:

The Best PDD Horse & Lunger Combination of the Championships receives a trophy.

Criteria for this award:

This award will be based on the horse scores from the official classes. It will be awarded to the highest final horse score achieved by a NSW combination. In order to achieve a 'final horse score' the horse scores for specific Pas De Deux are averaged to give a 'final horse score' (i.e. on a per Pdd basis).

Best Squad Horse & Lunger Combination of the Championships:

The best NSW Squad Horse & Lunger Combination of the Championships receives a trophy.

Criteria for this award:

This award will be based on the horse scores from the official classes. It will be awarded to the highest final horse score achieved by a NSW combination. In order to achieve a 'final horse score' the horse scores for specific Squads are averaged to give a 'final horse score' (i.e. on a per Squad basis).

<u>Scores</u>: Scores will be posted as soon as possible after the class has been completed. Any queries must be submitted by the Team Manager to the Event Secretary.

The score sheets will be handed to the Team Manager for each Club at the conclusion of the event.

During the event the only people allowed to view score sheets are the judges. The final results will be forwarded to each Club within 48 hours of the conclusion of the Championships.

<u>Presentation</u>: Presentation of ribbons will take place on the Saturday evening for those completed classes time permitting and the presentation of ribbons for the balance of classes will take place at the end of the Championships, together with the presentation of trophies etc. in the arena.

CAMPING AND STABLING:

Stabling:

- Stables are available at \$30 per day with an additional \$75 payable for the first day to cover the cost of the 5 bales of shavings included in the stable hire.
- Additional bales are available at \$15 per bale. If required, the additional bales will be placed in the appropriate stable(s).
- You must indicate nights required per stable.
- Please calculate the overall cost from the above, ie/: per stable 1 night \$105; 2 nights \$135.
- In addition, there is a refundable equipment and cleaning bond of \$100 per stable required. Please pay this via Nominate.
- Stables will be allocated after receipt of entries. On leaving the stable, you will need to obtain an inspection to be eligible for your bond refund, which you will receive via Nominate.
- The Organising Committee will supply a small number of wheelbarrows. Please bring your own rakes and brooms.
- There are lockable tack rooms available in the stable block at \$20 per day. Please indicate via Nominate (or if more than 1, number required) for each day.

Day Parking:

- For any horses not using the stables (e.g. floating on a daily basis and tethering the horse to the float) there will be a 'per day stay' charge of \$20 per horse per day.
- Enter via Nominate if applicable. Please indicate the number of horses on a per day stay on the appropriate days.
- Trucks and floats not staying overnight (day parking) need to park in P7 as per the attached map (or check SIEC website for plan of site).

Camping:

- Camping for a powered site will cost \$35 per night. When booking via Nominate, please enter nights required. If additional power is required (using 2 outlets from one pole) a further fee of \$35 per night is payable.
- When booking a camp site via Nominate, please indicate whether you need space for a truck/float/caravan/tent as this makes allocation of sites easier.
- Please indicate the size of truck
- If hiring a caravan, please indicate on entry form so that site can be allocated and the lessor advised of the site number for delivery purposes.

Cabins on site:

- Forty two twin share cabins are available for hire at SIEC. Cost \$50 per cabin per night for 1 or 2 occupants ONLY. Supply your own linen, as this is not provided. The ablution block is close by.
- Bookings for cabins are made via Nominate, on a first come first served basis. You will be advised at time of entry if cabins are no longer available.
- No cooking is allowed in the cabins. These facilities are in the Mess Hall close by.
- There will be a refundable bond of \$50 per cabin which will be refunded after the cabin has been checked by the campsite manager that is has been left clean and tidy and the key is returned.

Presentation will be conducted on Saturday and Sunday afternoon during this event. It is **mandatory that vaulters are wearing** their Club track suit or uniform at these events. Vaulting shoes are not required.

Arm Numbers:

Numbers for individuals will be available for collection by the Clubs Team Manager at the Team Managers meeting. A refundable deposit of \$20 per vaulter is required – cash or a blank endorsed cheque will be accepted if preferred. Please place in an envelope with Club's name on the front when supplied to the Event Secretary. Clubs are to supply their own numbers for their squads.

Horse Points: As per Article 4. Australian Vaulting Rules 1^s January 2018.

Arena Familiarization:

Time will be made available prior to the event for a familiarization visit for all competitors and horses.

Practice area:

The practice area outside the main arena will be available at all times.

Swabbing:

Refer EA Medication Control Rules. All horses that compete will need to be available for random sampling for prohibited substances. Drug testing will be conducted under the direction of the swabbing steward. Vaulter and Lungers should be aware of the current EA Australian Anti-Doping Policy - <u>Equestrian Australia</u>

The Chief Steward must be notified prior to any horses leaving the venue.

Merchandise:

Merchandise will be available to order via Nominate. It may be possible to order items of merchandise during the competition and will be sent by mail when ready. There will be a 25% surcharge as well as postage on each of these items.

Volunteers:

It is expected that vaulters will provide helpers to assist with setting up and dismantling the arena, pencillers, time-keepers, announcers, gear stewards, runners, sales of merchandise, raffle tickets, etc.

Provide names of volunteers /helpers on the Nominate entry form when it is completed as the competition is only as successful as the volunteers provided. Please note volunteer provided within nominate cannot be your coach or lunger

New helpers are strongly encouraged to assist as training will be provided and it gives an insight into the running of the competition.

MUSIC:

All music for running in/out, compulsories and freestyles is to be submitted **no later than Monday 28th May**, **2018**

Please read carefully the following information as there is only *one way* of sending music:

- 1. The Team Manager or a nominated person from each club/competitor is to share their state music Dropbox* with Nicole Collett <u>nicaisha@hotmail.com</u>.
- 2. This person will be the contact person for music and will be contacted if there are any problems or questions
- 3. Each file must be clearly labelled as follows:
- a. For individual competitors:
 "Club Name, Vaulter's Surname then Initial, Horse Name, Class Example: "NEQC, Blogs J, Horse, Novice freestyle",
- b. For Pas de Deux:
 "Club Name, Both Surnames, Horse, Class"
 Example: "NEQC, Blogs, Smith, Horse, PDD"
- c. Where the club uses compulsory music for everyone using a particular horse:
 "Club Name, Horse's Name, Class"
 Example: "NEQC, Bremen, State Canter Compulsories All"
- d. For individual Compulsories:
 "Club, Last name, First initial, Event, Compulsories"
 Example: 'SVG, Smith, A, Advanced, Compulsories"
- e. For run in music:'Club name, Run in".Example: SVG Run In
- f. For individual with their own run in:

"Last name, classes in which this will be used' Example: "Smith, Run in Ind &/or Pdd"

- * When there are siblings competing please **always** include first initial to avoid confusion.
- ** A single folder containing all the correctly labelled music (i.e. no sub folders)
- 4. CD's, emails or USB sticks are not correct forms of delivery and will **NOT** be accepted. Alternative arrangements will only be made in exceptional circumstances.
- 5. **MP3 format is REQUIRED** and is the only format that will be accepted. Volume control on other file formats may be limited and can affect the music during the competition. The club's music manager will be notified if a file format is not acceptable. The music compiler <u>will not</u> amend incorrectly formatted files for you
- 6. A **final check** to ensure all the music has been received cannot be done until the final Order of Go has been distributed. Clubs / individuals are responsible for keeping their own list of the music they need and what has been sent through.
- 7. It is essential that all clubs / individuals **bring a copy** of all music in MP3 format on a flash drive to the event in case a file has been mislaid or corrupted during the sending process.
- 8. If music is not put in the Dropbox and is subsequently not supplied after an additional request, a generic music file may be used for the competitor.
- 9. Prior to the commencement of the event, Team Managers will receive a full list of any vaulters with no music
- 10. It is recommended that each vaulter bring a copy of their music on a USB to give to the Secretary at the show.


- Vaulters, lungers, coaches and officials must observe the EA and FEI Codes of Conduct.
