REACTIONS TO SITE C INQUIRY FILTER IN

The BC Utilities Commission's long-awaited final report in their Site C inquiry has been released.

The report only confirmed what most already feared regarding the costs of the controversial energy project.

Finishing the project at this point could see the project exceed its 8.3 billion dollar budget by more

than 2 billion, though neither of the other two options are any more attractive. The option to delay the project until 2024 would add at least 3.6 billion in costs, while shutting it down would cost nearly 2 billion, and thousands of jobs.

While reactions to the report were mixed, most seemed to cling to the project's downsides.

Galen Armstrong of the Sierra Club and Joy Foy of the wilderness committee, cited the dam's budgetary issues as a drain to the public wallet, while others hit the project for its environmental concerns. Foy also stated the success of the inquiry itself, saying it was a clear description of an elephant in the room from an independent source.

Not all were for the inquiry, however, as some pointed out its lack of clarity on the major issues.

Val Litwin of the Chamber of Commerce made sure to note that we can't overlook the project's impact on employment in BC as a factor in any final decision.

A decision is set to be made by the end of the year.

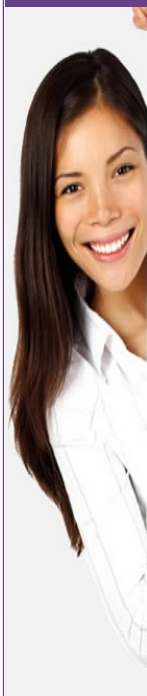

GAS PRICES SPIKE OVERNIGHT

If you've been putting off filling your gas tank, you may want to make it a priority today.

On Thursday, Nov 2, Fuel prices spiked in Dawson Creek, with some prices jumping by 15 cents a litre at the pumps. Dan McTeague, a senior analyst with GasBuddy.com, says he doesn't expect prices to drop any time soon due to pipeline maintenance in the US causing a crunch in supply.

Prices are up across the country, with Vancouver customers paying \$1.44 a litre, and Montreal customers paying \$1.31 per litre.

In Chetwynd, prices were at \$1.39 a litre, but later in the day dropped down to \$1.34.

TUMBLER RIDGE MINERS FINALLY PAID

The three year dispute between Tumbler Ridge miners and Walter Energy has finally reached its conclusion.

The Labour Relations Board ruled October 31, 2017 that the 280 miners laid off in Tumbler Ridge in 2014, are to receive roughly 13 million dollars in severance and termination pay.

The United Steelworkers' Union began their fight in April of 2014 after their workers arrived on site to discover that they had been laid off and the mine had been shut down.

The Labour Board had previously ruled in favour of the union in 2015, but the bankruptcy of Walter Energy complicated the ruling.

The miners are set to receive their shares by January of next year.

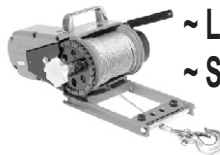
