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## SPECIAL COUNCIL MEETING

The District of Chetwynd held a special council meeting on Thursday, April 27th. The purpose of the special meeting was to adopt two bylaws, with a few extra items on the agenda.

The first bylaw was regarding the 2017-2021 financial plan which, after much discussion, budget meetings and reorganizing, was ultimately adopted. Before adopting the bylaw, Councillor Bassendowski raised a few questions regarding the borrowing of 1.5 million to fix East Trunk Main sewer line. Councillor Deck and Councillor Pfanner were in agreement that there were different ways to get the work done without borrowing. After more discussion, they came to the conclusion that without dipping into reserve funds or reorganizing other projects being paid for by the Peace River Agreement Fund, it just wasn't possible to get the work done this year without borrowing those funds. Councillors Deck and Pfanner still opposed the decision.

The second bylaw was regarding the levying of tax rates for municipal, hospital and regional District purposes, which was adopted without discussion.

Next on the agenda was an email that was sent to the District asking to support the application to designate the Salish Sea a UNESCO Heritage Site. Council voted to authorize a letter be sent in support of their application.

The next item up for discussion was an "Action Request Form" that was sent to the District by an unhappy resident of Chetwynd. The request form was regarding the coal trucks that are parking all over town and in residential areas. Chief Administrative Officer Doug Fleming mentioned that the District of Chetwynd has been in contact with the 2 companies trucking out of Conuma's mines. The conversations have been ongoing, with one company abiding. It was mentioned that there have been two issues. The parking of trucks in residential areas and the servicing they do on Chetwynd's streets causes a huge mess and excess coal is left all over. Many of the drivers have simply not been given direction where they can park and service their trucks. More communication with the companies can hopefully lead to a conclusion that satisfies the lot.

The last item on the agenda was from Julia Nelson of the Chetwynd Arts Council asking for a letter of support from Council that will be sent along with their application for the BC Hydro Go fund grant. Councillor Laura Wiesgerber suggested this grant to the Arts Council, which will go towards their annual "Arts in the Park" on Canada Day. The project has previously been funded out of pocket. This grant would allow for more supplies to be purchased that will help to cover a larger cross section of our community.

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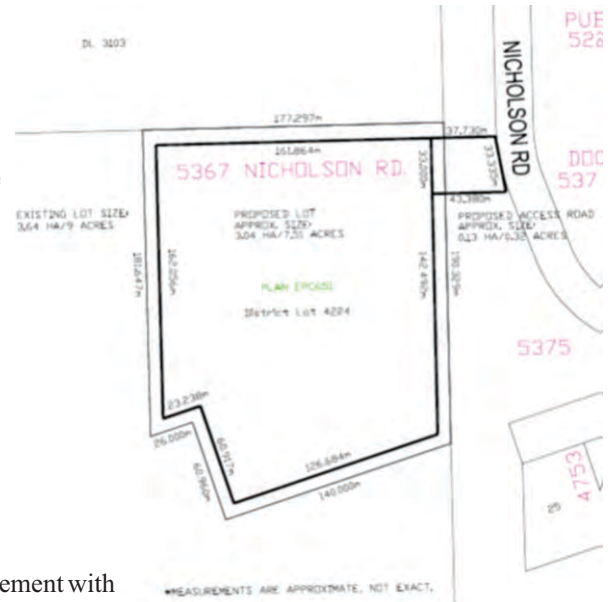
# DISTRICT OF CHETWYND CALL FOR EXPRESSIONS OF INTEREST

# MINISTER AND STAFF OF THE MINISTRY OF COMMUNITY, SPORT AND CULTURAL DEVELOPMENT PRESENTED WITH CHAINSAW CARVING

The District of Chetwynd made a presentation to the Minister and Staff of the Ministry of Community, Sport and Cultural Development on Tuesday April 25, 2017 in recognition of the Ministry's support and cooperation, in various forms, with the District over the last several years. Minister Fassbender was unable to attend the presentation because this Government is currently suspended due to the upcoming election, but the Deputy Minister - Jacquie Dawes and Assistant Deputy Minister - Tara Faganello along with key staff from the Ministry were able to attend to receive the presentation, which was a unique wood carving from the Chetwynd International Chainsaw Carving event.

The carving, entitled "First Breath" is a lifelike depiction of a mother and baby humpback whale carved from cedar, originally harvested from Vancouver Island. Chetwynd hosts an International Chainsaw Carving event each year, which is held in the second week of June. Twelve world class carvings are created during the competition and gifted to the community. This year Chetwynd wished to share one of its carvings with the Ministry to show its appreciation for the cooperation and support the Ministry provides to Chetwynd and other municipalities and local governments throughout British Columbia.

Mayor Nichols and Councillor Laura Weisgerber made the presentation to the staff at the Ministry and expressed thanks for their continued support of local governments in BC. Mayor Nichols stated that "this is a wonderful opportunity for our

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# MEET THE MAYOR

May 5, 2017

Well, the thing we knew was going to happen and that we were anticipating with no little angst, tough and resilient as we are, has come to pass. Softwood lumber is once again subject to import duties on shipments to the USA. Since most of Chetwynd's production is destined for residential construction projects in the USA, Chetwynd's mills and all those employed in the forest industry in Chetwynd, about 600 of us, are affected to some degree by the ruling.

Which means that the spinoff results of the tariff could affect all of us. Earlier in the winter at a Chamber of Commerce luncheon attendees were assured that our mills were well positioned to weather a tariff on softwood lumber, if not to enjoy it. This may very well be but it will result in serious erosion of the profit margin.

That said, I still carry around a high level of confidence in the rightness of Canada's position and the ultimate success of Canada's efforts to achieve an equitable solution to a problem that has haunted the lumber industry for decades. We have an army of highly skilled and knowledgeable negotiators from the west coast to Ottawa and beyond who understand the issues from tree to finished product delivered to the customer. We are well positioned to win again, as we have every time the USA attacked Canada through softwood tariffs.

The USA doesn't have a solid base in law or history with which to fight the tariff battles. Canada has both. US strategy is to flex muscle and bombast, neither of which carries a lot of weight in court. That also said, Canada cannot afford to slack off in our knowledge of both history and law nor in careful, meticulous preparation and presentations of our rock-solid position.

US producers are mainly land based – they own the land on which the timber grows. Their intent is to increase the value of their holdings and thus their profits. The spin-off result in the USA will be higher cost for home construction because the tariff will be charged through to the consumer. It is a sad commentary on the world we have created when profit becomes the primary driving force for decisions in the market place.

But let's not get too smug as we look south. We Canadians are not always above a little profit taking in the market place either. In fact, we are quite adept at it. We have to look no farther than the BreX scandal that shook the financial and mining community across North America in the 90s – and some folks have not recovered from that shock. Indeed, some Canadian mining companies are not above exploiting the people and the environment once they get outside the close scrutiny of provincial governments. Let's be thankful for a government that operates under law and has a care for the world we have inherited.

But the softwood tariff is our topic today. While I am confident that an equitable resolution will be found, it is the meantime that will sting, and time has a way of getting really mean when the disputes drag on. Interestingly, it is the smaller producers, those with fewer resources, that are feeling the brunt of the attack. I understand that the saw mill in Morristown in the beautiful Bulkley Valley, with about thirty employees, may have to lay off workers. I extend my condolences to Morristown on behalf of the District of Chetwynd.

Our Premier has written to the Prime Minister urging that US exporters of thermal coal be banned from using BC ports. While it sometimes feels good to flex muscles, escalating a trade war between a mouse and an elephant probably is not in Canada's best interests at the moment. Neither should we stir in buttermilk and yogurt with the softwood issue as the President has done. If we stick to softwood and negotiate in good faith with care and attention we will come through.

And then there is NAFTA. Am I glad we have strong minds with wills to match at the table!

## KELSEY'S CHRONICLE



The weather is warming up and that always gets me in gear to look at my garden and all the work it'll take to make it beautiful. Although it is a lot of work, it's fun work. There are so many things to keep in mind when gardening, as it is particularly tricky sometimes to get started when your thumb is not so green. I began my gardens 2 years ago from empty patches of lawn and this year I will be adding more vivacious flowers and hopefully get an abundance of vegetables, if I play my cards right. Even though it isn't quite time to plant, it's always good to begin preparing.

The first steps to a thriving garden is revitalizing it and waking it up from its winter nap. The best time to do so is when there is no more frost in the mornings and the soil is dry enough that it doesn't form a ball in your hand. Breaking up the clumps of soil and removing the old plants left from last season is a good idea. Aerating and adding fresh soil is a must, as your plants from last year have depleted the soil's nutrients. Also, if you're a composter, now's the time to add your mix to the soil and thoroughly work it in.

The next step would be planning your garden. This is more for vegetable gardens that have specific needs to thrive. There are several charts available in various almanacs... and on google (my favourite) that can help with planting times, when to harvest, even the best time to water each plant. Choosing your plants and flowers can be difficult with all the different things to take into account. Always check their tags for ideal growing conditions, like lighting, soil, and other climate conditions.

I came across a couple interesting tips which I will probably try this year, including using cardboard deep under your soil to block weeds, and using coffee grounds in the soil to deter slugs and cater to the acidic plants. There was also a tip for watering, using empty bottles. Poke a hole in the bottom, fill with water and place at the base of your plants for your own self watering garden, great for plants that don't like their leaves wet.

If you're a beginning gardener as I am and you want to get started but don't know how to begin, it's very easy to get overwhelmed. You can always start with a container garden, which tends to be easier upkeep. Container gardens can be basically anything bigger than a pot. People use everything from wood boxes to old wagons. Container gardens are great because of the likeliness of less weeds than a tradition ground garden. But always be aware of the depth needed to grow your desired plants. For example, carrots need over a foot deep of loosely packed soil. Sticking to above ground vegetables, flowers and plants with a shorter root base are better for container gardens.

Pruning, clipping and transplanting are all a good idea while the weather is still mild. Some say winter is the best time to prune, but it's mostly just to not shock the plant as much. As a rule of thumb, try not to prune if you already notice new growth. When transplanting, there are many wives' tales about transplanting trees and other plants around your yard. From personal experience, I can say that as long as you don't damage the root ball when removing it from the ground, it'll most likely make it, but sometimes conditions just aren't right at the location you've chosen. This is where you can lose before you even begin. Like the little pine, I attempted to relocate to an area of mostly clay.... it didn't last, but the other one I transplanted the same day is thriving in its new location, which had a richer dirt.

For all you gardening enthusiasts and new gardeners, get your shovels and hoes out, it's our time! Although it's not yet time to plant, preparing your garden is like a therapy in itself, pulling weeds in the sunshine, planning your new setup, and slowly but effectively beautifying your yard.

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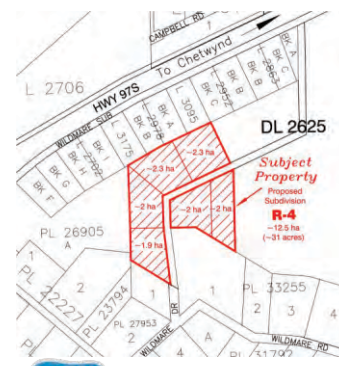
