CHETWYND PHYSICIAN WELCOMING & RETENTION COMMITTEE

A new committee has been formed to help recruit new doctors and nurse practitioners to Chetwynd. In an interview with Cole Papalazarou of Peace FM and councillor Clay Bassendowski, Clay described the committee as designed to, "Showcase Chetwynd and everything we have to offer to potential candidates for healthcare professionals - whether it be physicians or nurse practitioners - and in particular for them and their families, to show what we have to offer when they're coming to town to think about setting up practice or moving here."

Considering the fact that we desperately need more doctors to move to Chetwynd, the forming of a committee that's designed to do just that is a great initiative taken by Mayor and Council.

The committee is comprised of 6 people: Deanne Ennis from the District, Clay Bassendowski with the Chetwynd Council, and 4 local citizens: Tyria Plamondon, Ana Peasgood, Becky Borton and Andrea Smith.

"This isn't a new idea, this is something that a lot of communities have throughout the province and actually from coast to coast. So we're kind of taking other people's leads on it."

The committee is all volunteer and fuelled by the desire to bring in more doctors to Chetwynd.

"It was very difficult to narrow it down to 4. There's a lot of wonderful people in town that were considered, but we chose a team that we felt was going to reach out to a lot of different areas of town."

The project will be spearheaded by the 4 ladies, but to make it work help from the community is a must. If you're interested in helping, each of the 6 volunteers has their business cards on display with their emails at the District Office. You can also stop in at the

Library to see Ana Peasgood, or call the Visitor's Centre to get a hold of Tyria.

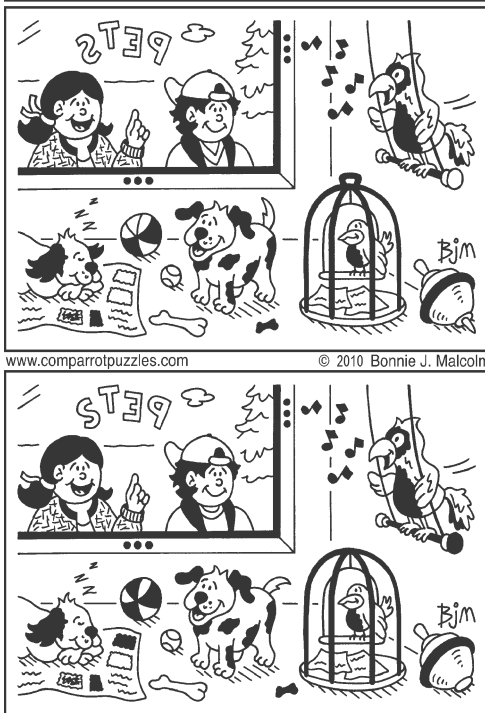

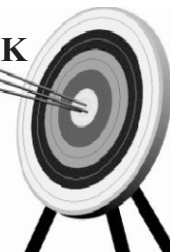

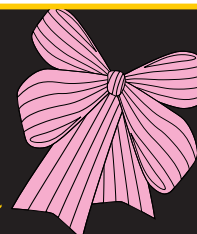

CHETWYND TRAFFIC TO INCREASE 50% BY 2039: STUDY

The Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure recently completed a traffic study of both provincial highways in the Chetwynd area.

The study looked at 17 kilometres of Highway 97 from Disher's Corner to the Hayward Subdivision Road. It also included the 3.6 kilometres of Highway 29 from the Jackfish Lake Road to the Highway 97 junction.

According to the study, an average of nearly 6,800 vehicles travel on that stretch of Highway 97 per day, while around 3,700 vehicles use the stretch of Highway 29 on a daily basis.

Heavy resource sector traffic accounts for between 10 to 20 per cent of total daily traffic through the district according to the study, and traffic in the District is expected to increase by 50 per cent in the next 25 years as the region braces for a spike in industrial development.

In the short term, the study suggests additional crosswalk signs for 46th Street in front of Chetwynd Secondary and Windrem Elementary schools, along with the removal of the current pedestrian-controlled light on Highway 97 near the Rec Centre. The CN Rail crossing on Highway 97 will also be monitored to see if it requires a gated warning system.

In the long term, the study predicts development will push traffic volumes to 10,180 vehicles daily along Highway 97, and 5,600 vehicles on Highway 29 by 2039.

The District will now integrate the Ministry Of Transportation study into its Official Community Plan and traffic planning work. The next District of Chetwynd council meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, September 8th.

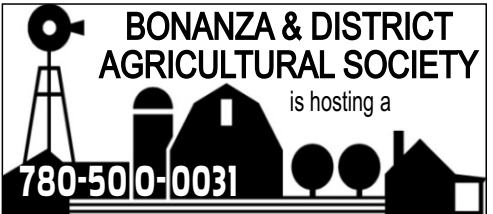

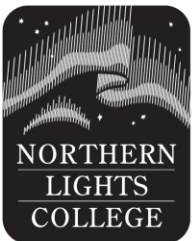

He notices that the saucer is extremely old and very valuable, so he walks casually into the store and offers to buy the cat for two dollars.

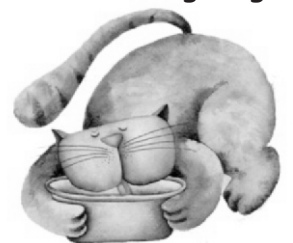

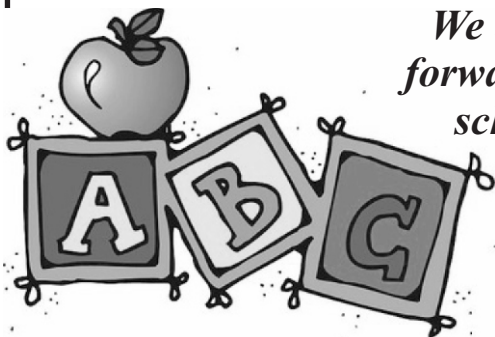

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DAWSON CREEK RCMP NEWS RELEASE

Dawson Creek RCMP had a relatively good week with only 181 calls for service during the week of August 23rd - 29th 2015. Included in the calls for service were 15 driving complaints, 3 impaired driving investigations, 1 excessive speed investigation, 10 motor vehicle collisions and 3 break and enters. Other than the two armed robberies and the theft of the ATM machine there were not a lot of high priority calls for the week. A male has been arrested in connection with the armed robbery at the Husky gas station located on 17th and Alaska Hwy. The male was arrested in Fort St. John after he completed another armed robbery in their jurisdiction. The 28 year old male has been remanded on the Fort St. John charges but is still awaiting crown approval for charge in Dawson Creek. The suspect in the armed robbery at the George Dawson Inn liquor store is still outstanding and police continue to seek the public's assistance in identifying the male. The third stolen vehicle related to the theft of the ATM machine from the Money Mart on Alaska avenue was recovered August 31st in Grande Prairie.

MAN ARRESTED IN CONNECTION WITH FORT ST. JOHN DRIVE-BY SHOOTING

Fort St. John RCMP have arrested a man believed to be connected to a drive-by shooting.

The incident occurred on the evening of Saturday August 29th at around 6:20 pm. Police were notified that someone had discharged a firearm at a vehicle in a parking lot in the 8500 block of 86th Street. The two people in the car received no injuries, and the suspects immediately fled the scene in a newer model greenish-grey GMC crew cab pick-up.

The RCMP believe this was a targeted shooting, and that there is no danger to the general public. RCMP also suspect that it is related to a shooting that occurred at an apartment in the 8600 block of 91 Avenue on Thursday August 27th.

Monday August 31st at around 1 pm, RCMP Cpl. Jodi Shelkie says officers saw a vehicle that may be associated with Saturday's shooting. The vehicle was pulled over outside of the Mac's Convenience Store on 100th Ave, and a male suspect was arrested.
