





Relief for British Columbians on the Horizon

Temporary relief is on the way for British Columbians whose ability to work has been affected by COVID-19, with applications for the \$1,000 B.C. Emergency Benefit for Workers (BCEBW) opening on May 1, 2020.

"This benefit is further help for British Columbians who are worried about paying their bills and making ends meet during the COVID-19 pandemic," said Carole James, Minister of Finance. "During these uncertain times, we want to get through this together by helping displaced workers support themselves and their families."

The BCEBW is a one-time, tax-free \$1,000 payment for British Columbians whose ability to work has been affected as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. Most people who are eligible for the new federal Canada Emergency Response Benefit (CERB) are also eligible for the BCEBW, including those who have run out of employment insurance (EI) benefits and subsequently qualify for the CERB.

To be eligible for the BCEBW, people must:

- -have been a resident of British Columbia on March 15, 2020;
- -meet the eligibility requirements for the CERB;
- -have been approved for the CERB, even if they have not received a benefit yet;
- -be at least 15 years old on the date of application;
- -have filed, or agree to file, a 2019 B.C. income tax return; and
- -not be receiving provincial income assistance or disability assistance.

Starting May 1, applications can be made online, at any time, and a link to the application portal will be available at: www.gov.bc.ca/workerbenefit

Also starting May 1, people can call 778 309-4630 or toll-free within B.C. at 1 855 955-3545, Monday to Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. (Pacific time) for general support or questions. Applications over the phone will begin on May 4.

Payments will start to go out within days of application. While there may be minor delays during the initial surge, government staff will be working to quickly process payments.

The benefit is part of the Province's \$5-billion COVID-19 Action Plan to provide income supports, tax relief and direct funding for people and businesses, and to support the services people count on.

TEC TALK WITH LEIF The Users File System

Windows has a pretty clear cut file system hierarchy that has remained relatively the same throughout it's iterations. On a generic installation, your Root directory will most often be labelled "C:". Under this directory we can find various folders, Windows (containing operating system files used by Windows), Program Files (Programs installed are stored here), Users (all User content for each individual user account set up under Windows can be found here).

When you create a User account, it's associated folder can be found within "C:\Users", and many of the files you download or create while using that account will be found within your User folder. For instance, files downloaded while browsing online will typically default to the C:\Users\Example\ Downloads folder (replacing "Example" with your user account name). When you save a document you are working on in a productivity application (Such as Microsoft Word or Excel), they default to the C:\Users\Example\Documents folder. From here, it's not difficult to guess where Pictures, Videos and Music will be located/saved.

Creating your own folders within these folders is an excellent way to keep your files organized and reduce clutter. It's a good idea to periodically check your Downloads folder and remove old files or transfer to more appropriate folders (pdf's and word documents to Documents folder, downloaded pictures to pictures folder, etc).

Knowing where your important files are stored makes backing them up a lot easier, pop in a USB stick, and copy your C:\Users\Exampe\Pictures folder to the USB stick and melt away your worry. Of course, it's a good idea to know just how much storage those files will take up. If you right-click a file or folder, you will see the option "Properties", this dialog will give you a good amount of information on the file or folder such as when it was created, the last time it was modified, it's access permissions, as well as how much space it takes up. With the knowledge of how much space your file or folder takes up, you can then make an educated decision on which external storage device to purchase.

The action plan builds on the federal government's COVID-19 Economic Response Plan and delivers there key supports for people, including:

enhancing the B.C. Climate Action Tax Credit to provide up to \$218 per adult and up to \$64 per child in July 2020:

introducing a rental supplement of \$300 per month for eligible households with no dependents and \$500 per month for eligible households with dependents:

providing an emergency \$300 per month for the next three months to individuals receiving income assistance or disability assistance and who are not eligible for EI or the CERB;

freezing all B.C. student loan repayments, interest free, until Sept. 30, 2020;

halting all evictions due to non-payment of rent for the duration of this emergency;

delaying several tax filing and payment deadlines for income tax, the employer health tax, provincial sales tax, municipal and regional district tax, motor fuel tax, carbon tax and tobacco tax;

reducing the school property tax rate for commercial properties to achieve an average 25% reduction in the total property tax bill for most businesses; and

changing the Employment Standards Act to ensure immediate job-protected unpaid leave for workers affected by COVID-19, so they can stay home as needed.

6 tips for safe cycling

Biking on city streets presents dangers to cyclists, motorists and pedestrians alike. To ensure everyone's safety, here are six guidelines bicyclists should follow.

- **1. Wear a helmet** In the event of an accident, wearing a helmet greatly reduces your chances of suffering a serious head injury. Make sure that your helmet fits well and that the straps sit snugly against the sides of your face and under your chin.
- **2. Inspect your bicycle** A well-performing and properly maintained bike is safer than one that's run down and needs work. Regularly check the following before hitting the road:

Tire pressure

The condition of the spokes

The alignment of the wheels and the forks

The tautness of the chain

The functioning of the brakes.

Only ride bikes that are the appropriate size. Ensure that the seat and handlebars are set at the right height.

- **3.** Make yourself visible If you cycle at night or when visibility is limited, make sure your bike is equipped with a white front light, a red rear light or reflector, white reflective tape on the front forks and red reflective tape on the rear forks. As an extra precaution, consider wearing reflective clothing and equipping your bike with vertical and horizontal safety flags.
- **4. Make yourself hear** Bikes are extremely quiet, so it's important to always announce your presence to other cyclists and pedestrians. Use a bell, horn or your voice to indicate that you're passing or approaching.
- 5. Communicate your intentions Know the hand signals for turning and

stopping and always use them when changing lanes, making a turn or coming to a stop. This is for the benefit of motorists and other cyclists. Moreover, make sure to do a shoulder check before signalling and another one just before turning.
