Here are a few guidelines for handling your health concerns:

- ~ Call HealthLink BC at 8-1-1 for confidential health information and non-emergency services 24/7. For deaf and hearing-impaired assistance (TTY), call 7-1-1.
- ~ For non-urgent care, use community health services including your family practitioner or walk-in clinics, where available. Be sure to note any changes to holiday clinic hours.
- ~ Note the holiday hours for local pharmacies, and ensure prescriptions are filled accordingly.
- ~ If you have a cold, call HealthLinkBC at 8-1-1 for advice, or ask your pharmacist about over-the-counter medications to ease symptoms.
- ~ Remember, it's not too late to get a flu shot; check immunizebc.ca
- ~for clinic dates.
- ~ If you are concerned about a possible poisoning or exposure to a toxic substance, call Poison Control at 1-800-567-8911.

If at any time you believe you require urgent medical attention, do not hesitate to go to the emergency department or call 9-1-1 for transportation.

While emergency services are available 24/7, hospitals may experience higher than normal volumes at various times of the year. NH emergency rooms tend to patients who have experienced a sudden and/or unusual change in their health. This includes, but isn't limited to, breathing difficulties, severe bleeding or pain, broken bones, chest pain, overdoses and eye injuries.

Other tips to ensure you have a safe, healthy and enjoyable holiday season include:

~Wash your hands often with soap and water, and carry an alcohol-based hand rub with you. ~ Get regular exercise and avoid overindulging. ~ Drink responsibly ~ Get




Christmas is doing a little something extra for someone.









KELSEY'S CHRONICLE



I'm one to always wonder how things came about, the origin of things. Doing this job I have a reason to find out what, where, when, why and how. This week I am exploring the origin of Christmas lights, as well as Christmas trees.

Spruce, pines and firs are the most common conifers to display in homes. The first tree recorded in history was in 1576 in a keystone sculpture, in Turckheim, France. Origins date back even earlier as a winter solstice tradition, when they would hang evergreen boughs above doorways to remind them of the green they were soon to see once again, after the long cold winter. Because of this reason, evergreens have held a special spot in peoples heart for thousands of years.

In 16th century Germany, devout Christians would bring trees into their homes to decorate with fruits, nuts, and other foods like marzipan or gingerbread cookies. Martin Luther King is said to be the first to decorate his Christmas tree with candles after walking home and seeing the bright stars shine through the trees, he decided

to recreate that. The candles wax was melted and used to stick the candle to the branches. In 1848 a newspaper in England had an illustration of Queen Elizabeth and family gathered around a decorated Christmas tree. This brought about the beginning of the Christmas tree boom in England, Canada and the United States. Many Town's, cities, and villages throughout North America have a community tree that is decorated each year. Chetwynd has our very own tree, which is planted behind the downtown monument. Chetwynd made the responsible choice to plant a tree that will grow with our ever growing town, instead of cutting down a big fresh tree each year. Other towns and cities have adopted the same policy but some still choose to bring in a fresh cut tree each year.

Edward Johnson, Vice president of Edison Electric Light Company and associate of Thomas Edison, was the first to invent electric bulbs for Christmas trees. In 1882 he created 80 hand-wired red, white and blue incandescent bulbs to hang on his tree in his 5th Avenue home in New York City. This was viewed as a publicity stunt and didn't initially catch on. It wasn't until almost 20 years later, in 1900, that other stores and businesses in New York began using incandescent bulbs to decorate their store fronts windows. The first commercially produced Christmas lights were produced by General Electric Co. and came in strings of 8 sockets, each socket took 2 candela carbon filament lamps. Electric lights were generally too expensive for everyone until the 1930's, and it took until the mid-1950s for the use of such lights to be adopted by average households.

Christmas lighting does lead to some extensive recycling issues. Every year, more than 20 million pounds of discarded holiday lights are shipped to Shijiao, China, which has been referred to as "the world capital for recycling Christmas lights". As recent as 2009, many factories would burn the lights to melt the plastic and retrieve the copper wire, releasing toxic fumes into the environment. A safer technique was developed that involved chopping the lights into a fine sand-like consistency, mixing it with water and vibrating the slurry on a table causing the different elements to separate out, similar to the process of panning for gold. Everything is recycled: copper, brass, plastic and glass.

Whether your tree is adorned in popcorn strings, gingerbread cookies, glass balls and tinsel, garland and homemade ornaments or anything else, it's neat to know that hundreds of years ago, families were doing the same thing.

MEET THE MAYOR

December 9, 2016

Oh, the things we didn't know, didn't know we didn't know, didn't even want to know! But now we know, perhaps even against our better judgments. Or maybe we just think we know.

I attended the 2016 Mayor's Roundtable in Dawson Creek a few days ago. Interesting and informative presentations (with opportunities to question the presenters) by the Canadian Association of Petroleum Producers, the Ministry of Natural Gas, TransCanada Pipelines, BC Hydro, CN Rail, the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure, the Oil and Gas Commission, and Pembina Pipelines.

Surrounded and confronted by such an array of power, history, wisdom, and jargon, how could I not have learned something, however esoteric it be and tenuous its utility?

But I would like to share with you one idea that might be of interest to you. Natural gas, and its future in our area, always seems to get our ears. Having heard about LNG for years, having been persuaded of the urgency of keeping ahead of the pack (Qatar, USA, Australia), it is disconcerting that the pack is moving on and we are still talking.

Qatar and Australia have been in this business for years. The USA is just getting into the business in a big way. Part of our surplus gas and low-price problem is not that the North East is producing so much more than in the past, though the capacity exists, but that reserves in the northeastern United States are being tapped in a huge way. Not only tapped, but shipped to market through existing facilities on the Gulf Coast.

Here's how it is working out for the USA: pipelines already exist to move the gas from Pennsylvania to the Gulf. Facilities on the coast already exist to convert gas to liquid, and boats are bobbing on the waves panting to take it on. Those are the advantages.

Disadvantages exist that make BC gas attractive to the markets in Asia. Shipping distances and costs from US Gulf Coast ports to the Asian markets are much greater than from Prince Rupert or Terrace; the Panama Canal passage is an additional charge; perhaps greatest handicap of all is the temperature of the Gulf Coast. The higher average temperature alone makes the liquefaction of the gas about 20% more expensive than liquefaction at BC's north coast.

LNG sourced in Qatar and Australia has at least the temperature to add to its cost and travel distance from Australia is about the same as from British Columbia.


The Montney play here in our region is recognized as world class with reserves that will last for several hundred years. Our handicap is the distance to the coast. But it's not an overwhelming obstacle. Pipelines can be built and will be built when the final investment decisions (FID) are made.

I understand that another window of opportunity to break in to the market may be opening perhaps as early as 2025. Are we ready with all the negotiations and consultations successfully concluded and mutually acceptable? To go through that window requires that a FID be made within three or four years. Dithering will not get us into the markets.

(As a matter of collateral interest, the USA has just given notice of the discovery in Texas of the largest oil deposit in North America – in the billions of barrels. Take note Alberta, Ottawa.)

Now you also know a bit of that which I think I might know. One thing is certain: the future, from our mortal perspectives, is uncertain, unknowable. We cannot see beyond the moment so, as the wisdom of the ages reminds us: whatever your hand finds to do, throw your energy into doing it well. Perhaps together we can encourage our governments to do what they can to move our latent but lagging economies forward.


