CHETWYND'S DERYK ENGELLAND WINS NHL'S MARK MESSIER LEADERSHIP AWARD

Chetwynd native Deryk Engelland of the Vegas Golden Knights won the Mark Messier Leadership Awards last night at the NHL Awards in Las Vegas.

The award is presented to the player who exemplifies great leadership qualities on and off the ice and who plays a leading role in his community growing the game of hockey.

At the Vegas home opener on October 10, Engelland made a passionate pregame speech in honor of the 58 killed in the mass shooting on October 1st. Engelland and his wife, Melissa, started a program inviting those affected by the shooting to Vegas games throughout the season, and met with each of them following the game. He also partnered with Ronald McDonald House and Three Square to help families in need, and continued his work with local firefighters, raising over \$40,000 over the

past five years for children who cannot afford to play hockey.

Former NHL player Mark Messier chose Engelland to win the award over two other nominees.





HAUGAN HONORED AT **NHL AWARDS**

The late and former North Peace Navigators Coach Darcy Haugan was awarded the NHL's Willie O'Ree Community Hero Award.

Haugan's widow Christina Haugan accepted the award on his behalf, whilst surrounded by 10 of the 13 bus crash survivors. She said she was honored to accept the award not because of the tragedy, but because of the life he lived every day.

Haugan was the GM and head coach of the Navigators from 2003-2015, and then became the head coach of the Broncos shortly after. A memorial is in works for the town of Peace River.

A tribute to the Broncos was also played at the award ceremony. The trip for the survivors and their families was sponsored by the NHL, Air Canada, and the Hard Rock Hotel and Casino.

NORTHERN LIGHTS COLLEGE COMMUNITY DINNER

The Northern Lights College Board of Governors held an informative and interactive dinner and presentation at the Cottonwood Hall this past Wednesday. They asked the community to weigh in on their opinion of what a community college should look like and what they can do to better their role in Chetwynd.

Todd Bondaroff, NLC's Associate Vice President of Student Services and Communications led the conversation and presented John Kurjata, NLC's appointed Chair Member, to explain how they are collecting feedback through community consultations to help meet the needs of community college students now and in the future.

President and Ceo Bryn Kulmatycki explained that sustainability is a challenge for the college so the need for generational planning is crucial. There has been a decline in enrolment for the college and other community colleges over the past decade with predictions being that the numbers will plummet further if changes aren't made to the current system.

Each table had a representative from the college collecting information from the community. Several points were reiterated by each group, with a few major points being the need for better correspondence options to take course offered elsewhere through skype or conference call instead of driving to the next closest town, or moving away to pursue education. Another valid point that was stressed by the community is the option of specialty interest courses like cooking, gardening, dance, piano, guitar or other fun lessons helping to better connect people and make the college into more of a community hub. The need for better marketing and advertising to make the community aware of what's happening at the college was another point made by many groups. And a great statement was made that they need to target the students at the high school who aren't being drafted by universities to help them feel that their post secondary education is just as important.


Studies show that students who attend a community college for two years after high school, before eventually moving away to a university, had no difference in grade point averages by the end of their 4 years. This just goes to show that universities may seem like the more appealing option but beginning your post secondary learning in your own town at a community college makes no difference in the end other than less student debt, and your kids staying closer to home for longer.

The college offers not only university transfer courses, they also have upgrading options through their career and college prep courses for those needing upgrades before beginning a program. They have apprentice trades training programs, general interest courses, workforce training and have even offered introduction to trades programs, helping students get a better grasp on what they would like to pursue.

With all the information collected by Northern Lights College's Board of Directors at the community consultations, they plan to re evaluate their current system and hopefully make some changes to help keep up with where times are going.



NEW GOV'T PROGRAM TO ASSIST RESIDENTS WHO CAN'T RETURN TO THEIR HOMES AFTER A DISASTER

"Throughout last year's wildfires and floods, and during this year's spring floods, the Canadian Red Cross stepped up to support our government and British Columbians in times of need," said Jennifer Rice, Parliamentary Secretary for Emergency Preparedness. "In a catastrophic emergency, the Red Cross's experience, systems and technology will support our local government-managed emergency social services, to reach people as quickly as possible."

The new Recovery Transition Program is the first program of its kind offered in B.C., and was jointly developed by Emergency Management BC (EMBC) and the Canadian Red Cross. The program is in its early stages. EMBC and the Red Cross will work with local governments to implement it as quickly as possible.

"We can't overstate the impact on communities and families during times of disaster," said Kimberley Nemrava, Canadian Red Cross vice-president for British Columbia and Yukon. "With the support of generous British Columbians, and in close collaboration with the government, we are pleased to be able to provide this assistance."

British Columbia operates one of the most-generous emergency social services programs in Canada, providing people with immediate emergency supports. These supports can include short-term shelter, food and clothing. Those affected by an emergency typically receive emergency social services support for up to 72 hours. The Province has been extending this timeline to meet the needs of those impacted by the flooding in Grand Forks.

The Recovery Transition Program will commence when emergency social services concludes, and provide assistance for up to 90 days to households that are primary residences and have been determined to be uninhabitable by the local government.

Quick Facts:

- The Recovery Transition Program will provide support and basic financial assistance to people who cannot return to their homes, giving people the support they need to get back on their feet.
- It is the first program of its kind offered in British Columbia. It was jointly developed by EMBC and the Canadian Red Cross.

The program will - Provide families with financial support for basic needs like housing, food and personal needs.

- Prioritize homes that have been assessed as uninhabitable or having major damage.
- Homes considered uninhabitable (tagged "red" or "yellow" through damage assessments) will receive:
- Lump sum payment of \$2,850 for 30 days of basic support assistance.
- Up to two extensions based on verifiable need (for a total of \$8550 for 90 days of support assistance).
- Red Cross to manage extension approvals and eligibility assessment for other supports on a case-by-case basis.
- The Canadian Red Cross will manage the administration of the Recovery Transition Program.
- For First Nations people on reserve, this type of assistance is provided through the federal department, Indigenous Services Canada.
- Recovery Transition Assistance will also be complemented by Canadian Red Cross assistance that focuses on highly vulnerable families. This assistance is already being provided through the Canadian Red Cross, and has been since the floods began.

BC HYDRO AWARDS SITE C TRANSMISSION LINES CONTRACT

BC Hydro has announced a \$113 million contract to build the Site C transmission line.

The contract was awarded to Allteck Line Contractors, a company that is headquartered in Burnaby and has offices in Dawson Creek. The company will be building two 75 kilometre, 500-kilovolt lines between the Peace Canyon generating station and the planned Site C substation.

The transmission lines, which are expected to start building this summer and be completed in 2023, will deliver power generated at the dam to other areas of the province.
