The Push for RCMP Body Cameras

As the debate over police officers' use of force intensifies, Prime Minister Justin Trudeau said today he believes Mounties should start wearing body cameras. During his daily news conference outside of Rideau Cottage, Trudeau said he raised the issue with RCMP Commissioner Brenda Lucki during a phone call earlier this morning.

"It is something that is, in my opinion, what we need to move forward with," he said. The prime minister said he also plans to raise the issue of outfitting officers with body cameras when he speaks with the premiers later in the week, "so we can move on it as quickly as possible. "I think there are discussions we need to go forward on logistics, on the cost, on the cost to provinces where there is contract policing in place," he said. "But the challenges that I've heard are more logistical and economic concerns about remote areas and the way those cameras would work."

The RCMP is facing fresh allegations of racism and police brutality brought forward by Athabasca Chipewyan Chief Allan Adam over the weekend. Adam told a news conference that he was beaten by RCMP officers and that his wife was manhandled in March when police stopped him for an expired licence plate outside a casino in Fort McMurray. Just last week, an RCMP officer in Nunavut was caught on camera using his truck's door to knock a man over before arresting him.

Calls for RCMP reform are part of a broader debate in this country about police use of force, inspired both by incidents in Canada and by the continent-wide wave of protests triggered by George Floyd's death in police custody in Minneapolis.

The RCMP has more than 20,000 members and, outside of its federal policing obligations, acts as the provincial police in most provinces and territories.





The RCMP has run two pilot programs on body cameras. After conducting a feasibility study in 2016, the Mounties opted not to implement body cameras until "such time as available technology can meet its specific operational requirement," said RCMP spokesperson Marie-Christine Lemire.

Last year, the RCMP's commanding officer in Nunavut requested that RCMP national headquarters look into body cameras in response to calls for police accountability from local politicians.

Lemire said the "review is ongoing and will be provided to the commanding officer when complete."

Government fails to deliver consultation on moose hunt

The provincial government is taking another step in caribou conservation without any real or meaningful local consultation.

This latest move wasn't announced, but instead it was leaked out. Maybe that's because it is, in a word, whacky. The government wants to save the mountain caribou by opening the hunt for baby moose and their mothers.



The idea behind this moose hunt is this. Wolves are the main predators of both caribou and of moose. If there are fewer moose, the wolves will die out. If the wolves die out, then the mountain caribou will be protected.

My colleagues in the Official Opposition have searched high and low for some kind of science that would be driving this decision. We've yet to find it. It seems more like an idea from Elmer Fudd, especially when you consider the province has been trying to PROTECT moose populations for years.

Instead of a science-based decision, the moose hunt seems to be based purely on a fear of criticisms of hunting wolves directly. Hunting moose doesn't come with the same kind of opposition that hunting wolves does. Make no mistake, the goal here is still reducing the number of wolves. It's just making a choice to starve them rather than shoot them. That doesn't seem like a very humane choice – and it's also less direct and effective.

It was also a decision made behind closed doors in Victoria, without any local consultation. People here in the Peace are still upset about the lack of meaningful consultation on protecting the mountain caribou all through last year. People wanted government to hear from them and get the benefit of local knowledge. The community had a clear recommendation that a direct cull of wolves would be the most effective, quickest, and most humane way to protect caribou stocks.

But from an office in far away Victoria, the government chose a different path. The people of the Peace share the same desire to protect these northern herds, the government ignores their advice. Instead they picked a path that has closed large swaths of the backcountry and puts our local economy and way of life at risk.

The government's caribou plan is failing the caribou, it's failing moose populations, and it's failing local communities.



Rural Property Taxes

If your property is not located in a city, town, district or village, it is in a rural area. When you own property or lease Crown land in a rural area, you will receive your property tax notice from the province's Surveyor of Taxes Office every June. You pay your property taxes to the province. Property taxes are due by July 2nd,

Where do I pay my property taxes?

Get up to speed on fishing regulations

Fishing regulations play an important role in aquatic conservation, biodiversity and

Fishing regulations play an important role in aquatic conservation, biodiversity and habitat preservation. Before you head out on the water, consult your regional fishing regulations for any updates and to ensure that you're fishing legally and sustainably.

Get your licence

A fishing licence is almost always mandatory if you're between the ages of 18 and 64. Requirements for younger and older anglers vary by province and territory. If your area offers a variety of licences, they may be subject to different fishing quotas.



The right equipment

Before you head out on the water, ensure your fishing tackle complies with regional regulations. Depending on where you intend to fish, there may be restrictions on the use of live bait and barbed hooks. There may also be a limit on the number of hooks and lines permitted.

When and where

Fishing may be restricted to certain periods of the year in your province or territory. There might also be different regulations in place for specific bodies of water or regions based on local populations and conservation efforts.

Know your limits

Not all fish are created equal, and they may be subject to different size restrictions and bag limits. Some species may be off limits altogether. To ensure compliance with local regulations, you need to be able to identify the species you catch.

Specific fishing regulations vary by location. Provincial and territorial governments manage freshwater species in their region, with the exception of salmon in British Columbia. The federal government is responsible for most marine species. Be sure to consult the appropriate department of fisheries website for more details.

Granola and berry parfait

Ingredients

- 4 cups rolled oats
- •1/4 cup hulled sunflower seeds
- •1/2 cup walnuts, roughly chopped
- •1/2 cup peanuts, roughly chopped
- •1/2 cup almonds, roughly chopped
- •2 tablespoons poppy seeds
- •1 teaspoon cinnamon
- •1 teaspoon salt

- •1/2 cup maple syrup
- •1/2 cup olive oil
- •1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- •1/2 cup grated coconut
- •500 grams frozen mixed berries
- •1/2 cup sugar
- •650 grams plain Greek yogurt
- •A few fresh raspberries
- •A few fresh mint leaves

Directions

- 1.Preheat the oven to 350 F (175 C) and line a baking sheet with parchment paper. 2.In a large bowl, mix together the rolled oats, sunflower seeds, walnuts, peanuts,
- almonds, poppy seeds, cinnamon and salt.
- 3.In another bowl, combine the maple syrup, olive oil and vanilla extract. Pour this mixture over the dry ingredients and stir well to incorporate.
- 4. Pour the mixture on the prepared pan and press using a spatula to ensure an even layer. Bake for 12 minutes.
- 5.Add the coconut and stir well. Press down again with a spatula and bake for another 12 minutes. Let cool completely on the baking sheet.
- 6. While the granola is cooling, combine the frozen berries and sugar in a small pot. Cook over high heat until the sugar has dissolved. Lower the heat and let simmer for about 20 minutes or until the berries have mostly broken down. Using a hand blender, purée the mixture until smooth.
- 7.Once the granola has cooled completely, break it up into chunks with your hands or use a wooden spoon.
- 8.Using six small drinking glasses, pour about half a cup of yogurt into each. Add 1/4 cup of the berry purée, followed by 1/4 cup of yogurt. Top each glass with 1/4 to 1/2 cup of the granola and garnish with a few raspberries and mint leaves.

This dish is wholesome, delicious and easy to prepare. Serve it at a festive breakfast with family and friends or any time you'd like to indulge in a decadent morning meal.

No New Community COVID-19 Outbreaks

"Today, we are announcing one new case, for a total of 2,632 cases in British Columbia. One case from yesterday's total was removed due to a data correction "There are 193 active cases of COVID-19 in the province and 2,272 people who tested positive have recovered. "Of the total COVID-19 cases, 21 individuals are hospitalized, five of whom are in intensive care. The remaining people are recovering at home in self-isolation.

"Every health region in British Columbia has patients with COVID-19. Since the start of the pandemic, there have been 908 in the Vancouver Coastal Health region, 1,335 in the Fraser Health region, 130 in the Island Health region, 195 in the Interior Health region and 64 in the Northern Health region. The number of cases in the Vancouver Coastal Health region has been adjusted by one case to reflect a reporting error. "There has been one new COVID-19 related death in the Fraser Health region, for a total of 167 deaths in British Columbia. We offer our condolences to everyone who has lost their loved ones during the COVID-19 pandemic. "There have been no new health-care facility outbreaks and the outbreak at the Berkley Care Centre has been declared over. In total, five long-term care or assisted-living facilities continue to have active outbreaks.

"There have been no new community outbreaks. Public health teams are providing support for the eight ongoing community outbreaks. "As the recent B.C. COVID-19 modelling has shown us, we can safely reopen many businesses, return to in-class learning and gradually increase our social interactions, but we have to be cautious that we don't go too far and risk a resurgence in cases.

"The key is to minimize, manage and modify: minimize the number of new cases and close contacts, manage clusters and outbreaks with rapid contact tracing by public health teams and modify the measures we are all following, as needed.

"This means you should continue to assess your risks with every step and take precautions to protect yourself and those around you. Without exception, always stay home when ill and follow the rules for safe physical distancing. Remember that the provincial health officer's order limiting gatherings to no more than 50 people remains in place."

"We have learned a lot about COVID-19. Most importantly, we have learned that we must all stay vigilant, that a slow and thoughtful approach will protect us and keep us safe, and that by working together and doing our part, we will get through this."
