





Later that year in 1985, they had their first child Nelson. They were so proud a boy to carry on dad's name. Five years later they had their second child, Patricia. A beautiful girl that melted dad's heart away. In 1992, dad transferred to Chetwynd and the rest you can say was history. We would be remised not to mention Dads other family. Dad worked 37 years for the railway under BC Rail and CN Rail. It was his passion. There was not a day he didn't invited someone he worked with to the house for the family to meet. There wasn't a day he didn't look out the back window of the house in Chetwynd to see the train come in or out of the yard. He spoke highly of everyone he worked with. His co-workers were his brothers, or his kids is what he used to say.


