CHETWYND COUNCIL MEETING - AUGUST

On Monday, August 15, 2016, the regular council meeting was held for the month of August at the Municipal Hall in Chetwynd. After the call to order and the adoption of previous minutes, the meeting moved ahead to a presentation by Tonia Richter from the Chetwynd Chamber of Commerce.

Tonia presented the council with the Chamber of Commerce report and information on the progress of "Small Town Love," which, in short, is a website that promotes and showcases a lot of the businesses in Chetwynd. With 34 live links to the businesses websites, they had 130 new members sign up in 2015-2016, but unfortunately lost 15 members in 2014 due to businesses closing down. Tonia also went over the events the chamber has attended as well as upcoming chamber events and programs. Her last topic of discussion was the 2016 Chamber Excellence Awards Gala and Dinner, set to be October 22nd, 2016. There are 10 categories to be awarded, including: Business of the Year, Business Beautification, Non-profit Organization, and many more. Their vision is a semiformal cocktail reception, a great dinner, awesome entertainment and a perfect chance to do some networking in recognition of Chetwynd's businesses and their many great achievements.

In the Community Improvements Committee report, the previous talk of a public outdoor skating rink at Spirit Park has become a bigger topic than previously discussed. With the destruction left from the flood in June, unfortunately the permanent skating rink will be held off until 2017, but will still be used as a temporary rink for this winter. Next year the plans are to build not only a concrete base but side boards and an outbuilding for lacing up your skates. The plan is that it could be used year round, not just for winter. There has also been talk of new tennis courts, as the court by Don Titus elementary has seen better days. The hope is that they will be constructed beside the Rec Centre. In the old Visitor Centre area, the district hopes to build something that will pretty it up, like a gazebo, pergola or archway, but at this point nothing is set in stone.

In other business, the District received an email from Minister of Community, Sport and Cultural Development dated July 22nd, 2016 stating that Chetwynd has received a "Small Community Grant," which is an unconditional grant for municipalities to assist them in providing basic services. Grant amounts are based on a formula that factors in a base amount, population and

assessment values. These grants generally apply to municipalities with populations up to 19,000.

The District received another email from Westcoast Energy Inc. doing business as Spectra Energy regarding the Jackfish Lake Expansion Project, which is set to begin this month. Spectra Energy received approval of the project from the Nation Energy Board on July 15th, 2016 to start construction. The project involves the expansion of Spectra Energy's existing natural gas transmission pipelines. They are adding two loop segments of 36-inch pipeline along portions of the line that runs from Taylor to Chetwynd.

In news from the last council meeting on July 18th, there was a request for funding for the 2015-2016 winter avalanche
