



### PREPARE YOUR HOME FOR SPRING

(NC)Winter weather can wreak havoc on homes and gardens across Canada. Complete this home maintenance checklist from The Home Depot Canada before the warm weather breaks to ensure your outdoor space is ready for spring enjoyment.

1. If your home experienced any leaking or flooding, you must first dry out the area. Use towels, a mop and bucket or a wet/dry vacuum to remove the water that entered your home. Ensure you replace any affected drywall and clean carpets or upholstery thoroughly to prevent mould

2. Your roof takes quite a beating through the winter months. Once the warmer weather hits, take a look for any shingles that blew away or were damaged. Replace them to ensure your roof is waterproof ahead of spring showers.

3. Remove debris from your gutters using your hand or a leaf blower and run water from a garden hose down the eaves troughs. This will keep drainage running smoothly away from your home as rainfall increases in the spring.

4. In early spring, clean your deck with a power washer to remove stains and dirt build-up. On a dry day, apply a new coat of sealant to protect the deck from moisture damage, fungus growth and ultraviolet light in the summer ahead.

5. Get your yard ready for growing season by raking your lawn to remove winter debris, and pruning your perennials and trees ahead of their new growth.


Heartburn, also called gastric reflux, is a common gastro-intestinal symptom with a number of dietary triggers. This burning sensation in the chest area (close to the heart) is the result of stomach acid backing up into your esophagus.


There are a number of food triggers that can make heartburn worse. These include coffee and other caffeinated beverages, alcohol, citrus fruits, tomato products, fatty foods and spicy foods. Identifying and removing trigger foods from your diet can immediately reduce this symptom.

Taking antacids for heartburn can provide short-term relief, but they can also lead to other digestive complications. Instead, try adding more fibre to your diet, which keeps your digestive tract moving and prevents back up. Also, eating five or six smaller meals throughout the day, rather than three large meals, reduces the chance of overloading your digestive tract. Lastly, try to stay upright for at least two to three hours after your meal to let the food move down through your system. This also means you should avoid eating right before bed to allow your body time to start digesting before lying down.

When it comes to excess bloating due to intestinal gas, over-eating and inadequate chewing of food are common causes. Taking your time with meals and chewing food thoroughly can contribute to less swallowed air. In the large intestine, gas can also be produced by intestinal bacteria as they digest fibre, starches and carbohydrates – and it is the health of the bacteria in your gut that heavily influences your own digestive health. Keep the good bacteria happy and thriving by eating a balanced diet consisting of fibre-rich whole foods. ### CHETWYND MAYOR DEFENDS PINE RIVER GAS PLANT

Chetwynd Mayor Merlin Nichols is downplaying the recent label of the Pine River Gas Plant as the largest single polluter in the province.

Mayor Nichols feels that not only is the air pollution from the plant part of the cost of doing business, but that when put in the grand scheme of things, the plant isn't contributing as many polluting gases as the sources of pollution found in the Lower Mainland and other more populated areas.

Spectra Energy's Pine River Gas Plant, which is located on a district exclave about 45 kilometres west of the main Chetwynd townsite, is by far the biggest single emitter of major air pollutants, according to an annual pollutant inventory report released by Environmant Canada back in December.

The plant emitted 12,021 tonnes of sulphur dioxide in 2013, which is close to the amounts that were emitted back in 1998.

Though those numbers are high they do not exceed Environment Canada's limits, which are levels that would begin to pose a risk to human health. The concentration levels were found to have dissipated drastically in Hassler, the closest settlement

to the plant. The plant also emits far less greenhouse gases than Spectra's Fort Nelson Processing Plant, which is the province's largest emitter of such gases.

The provincial government recently released the Human Health Risk Assessment of Oil and Gas Activity in the Northeast, which found that the health risk from oil and gas activities remains low. Fort St. John hosted an information session on those findings on Tuesday night, which was attended by 16 members of the public. The next info session is scheduled for April 8th at the Northern Lights College Campus in Dawson Creek.

# DAWSON CREEK RCMP RESPONDS TO SUSPECT ABUSING DOG

The Dawson Creek RCMP has arrested a male suspect on a number of charges – including animal abuse.

Police received a call on March 28, 2015 that a male was seen hitting a dog multiple times, according to Cpl. Dave Tyreman.

"Upon arrival, the male fled from police tossing his dog over a fence and attempting to flee through back yards to escape custody," writes Cpl. Tyreman. "Police located the 33-yearold man at a residence where a struggle ensued during the arrest."

Cpl. Tyreman says the suspect also provided police with a false name, and upon further investigation, it was revealed that the male had previously assaulted a female.

The suspect, whose name is not being released, is facing one count of assault, one count of forcible confinement, one count of personation, two counts of resisting arrest, and one count of willfully causing unnecessary pain to an animal.

The suspect remained in custody until his first court appearance on March 30, 2015.
