NLC TRAINING OPPORTUNITIES TO START IN JUNE FOR WORKERS AFFECTED BY MINE SLOW-DOWNS

Mine workers affected by the industry slow-down and suspensions will be given the opportunity to sign up for additional training at Northern Lights College's (NLC) Tumbler Ridge Campus starting in June thanks to provincial funding aligned with the B.C.'s Skills for Jobs Blueprint.

Peace River South MLA Mike Bernier was in Tumbler Ridge May 21 for the funding announcement that has provided NLC with a \$150,000 grant to support workers affected by the suspension of the Tumbler Ridge regional coal mines.


"This is a much needed initiative by the province to bring some relief to these workers who are looking to re-train," said Donna Merry, NLC's Tumbler Ridge campus administrator. "The funding that the Ministry of Advanced Education is providing will allow us to offer a broad range of affordable training opportunities for eligible candidates — that's a huge investment to help these people along towards developing new skills that will add to their existing skill-sets."

Applicants interested in the training opportunities must meet several eligibility requirements:

- •All residents of Tumbler Ridge are eligible. Business owners and employees of local companies impacted by the economic downturn who reside elsewhere or who have relocated are also eligible. Candidates may be asked to provide proof of residency or past employment with a local employer.
- •Candidates who have been on EI, or who are currently on EI, must speak with WorkBC for sponsorship (if EI claim has completed), and permission to enroll (if EI claim is current). WorkBC will work with individuals to support training according to their action plans. The Work BC office operates on the Tumbler Ridge Campus on Thursdays from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Applicants interested in any of the following courses are asked to phone WorkBC at 1-855-782-8744 for more information and to arrange an appointment. Case managers will assist people by phone and/or in Tumbler Ridge. The College reserves the right to limit the number of courses per individual.


Mail Heist at Chetwynd **Post Office**


The Chetwynd post office was robbed last weekend.

DAWSON CREEK RCMP NEWS RELEASE

Dawson Creek RCMP responded to 200 calls for service during the week of May 24th - 30th 2015. Included in the calls for service were 30 driving complaints, 17 thefts, 8 collisions, 12 break and enters and four impaired driving investigations.

On May 24th 2015, Dawson Creek RCMP assisting Ministry of Children and Families attended a residence in the 9100 block of 8th street in Dawson Creek. Upon arrival RCMP seized the residence due to the presence of an illegal marihuana grow operation in the residence. A search warrant was obtained and 39 marihuana plants were seized. Additionally 10 firearms were seized from the residence including one handgun. Three of the firearms were loaded at the time of the seizure. Two young children were present in the residence at the time of the investigation. Police are recommending charges of production of a controlled substance, unsafe storage of firearms, and unlawful possession of firearms against a 35 year old male.

On May 26th Dawson Creek RCMP responded to a complaint of break and enter in the 900 block of 91A avenue in Dawson Creek. Through investigation police were able to identify two suspects and subsequently arrested a 21 year old female and an 18 year old male. 21 year old Dallas Horseman has been remanded in custody on two counts of possession of stolen property, one count of break and enter and one count of uttering threats. The 18 year old male was released on a promise to appear with conditions.

In the early morning hours of Sunday May 31st, Dawson Creek Traffic services responded to a request for help from Spirit River RCMP. A female had stolen a black dodge pickup truck in Spirit River and was headed to Dawson Creek. RCMP officers successfully deployed three spike belts and were able to take the 24 year old female into custody without further incident. The female was turned over to Spirit River RCMP to complete their investigation.

"Our Government remains committed to supporting law-abiding firearms owners, while also protecting the safety of Canadians," said Mr. Zimmer. "With the passage of Bill C-42 in the House, we are one step closer to bringing common sense to our firearms licensing regime."

Included in Bill C-42 is the call for mandatory safety training for potential first-time owners, a streamlined licensing system, and the removal of the requirement to carry a separate document to transport firearms to activities such as target practice or a competition at a shooting range. The Bill will also amend the Criminal Code to ensure that the property rights of lawful firearms owners are protected.

"These amendments continue our balanced approach to firearms," said Mr. Zimmer. "One that is helping us protect the safety of Canadians, while at the same time reducing the administrative burden for law-abiding hunters, farmers, and sports shooters."

This legislation will now move to the Senate for the next stage of the legislative process.

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CHETWYND COUNCIL MEETING

On June 1, 2015, the District of Chetwynd held a regular council meeting.

Council received and discussed two pieces of correspondence. The first letter was sent by Robert Link of Murray's Pub and Kitchen. The letter was in regard to the vending trucks that have set up next to the empty lot of the former High Country Inn, and the impact he feels they are having on his and other local businesses. He stated that his, along with many other businesses pay thousands in taxes to the district, while vendors only pay permit fees.

Council came to the conclusion vendors would only be allowed to carry out business if they are located on private land, and if they make a deal with those land owners. A grace period of 30 days was agreed upon so that those vendors may make alternate arrangements.

A second letter from MLA Mike Bernier requested that the District assist the SPCA in securing funding needed to complete capital projects. The District agreed that the SPCA provides an invaluable service to the South Peace and that they will support the SPCA with the \$5,000 funding recommendation.

The Mayor and Council also agreed to the Chetwynd Public Library proposal for funding renovations as per the federal government Canada 150 Infrastructure Grant Program with matching funds up to \$225,000.

The last item of business was the proposed sewage treatment plan improvements loan authorization bylaw. The bylaw to borrow over \$1,500,000 was passed as 10% of the electors did not sign the elector response.

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MEET THE MAYOR

Fair Share has been with us for almost 20 years. Starting small, the grant has grown substantially over the years. In fact, the growth has been such that the Government felt constrained to open negotiations to reduce its impact on Government resources. At a growth rate of almost 8% Chetwynd's share of the provincial money pot would have more than doubled in the next ten years. When looking at the pot from the Government perspective, it is not hard to see what Government saw – an unsustainable drain on provincial resources.

There was a political drain as well as a financial drain. It was becoming increasingly difficult to explain to the rest of the province why we in the Northeast were receiving Fair Share and none of the rest of the province was so lucky. From our vantage point the explanation was not difficult; we understood the governing principles of Fair Share and we knew why the Northeast needed, deserved, and must continue to receive Fair Share in some equitable manner. It didn't take a degree in economics to recognize where industrial infrastructure was located and where the stresses on social infrastructure were located.

There is another factor that complicated the picture. At the beginning of the grant, Fair Share was located in the Ministry of Finance where it should be. Some years ago the wisdom of Government transferred it to the (now) Ministry of Community, Sport and Cultural Development where it became a major drain on Ministry resources and a hard political sell to the other communities. When Premier Clark promised during the election campaign to extend Fair Share for ten years we all assumed that her promise included the same conditions that we then enjoyed. Wrong assumption. Back in Victoria cooler, apolitical heads explained why this must not happen and here in the Northeast we began to be just a little uncertain about its future. (Do I need to explain why Fair Share is crucial to Chetwynd's ongoing viability? It represents 46% of District revenue.)

Fact is, we were only a little surprised when, in late winter, we received a letter from Minister Oakes notifying us of the Government's intention to open discussions and have a Fair Share agreement completed by April 30 (this year!). It's done! The new agreement retains much of the language of the old agreement but with a new name and a tapering off of the steep climb in the rate of increase. The Northeast received its regular grant for 2015 of approximately 46 million. For 2016 the grant will be topped out at 50 million and remain at 50 million for the next three years when a COLA will kick in. This brief comment represents the essentials of the agreement. For Chetwynd the new agreement means that we can continue with regular infrastructure upgrades in streets, water, and sewer. With the completion of the District Office there is an additional half million annually to put towards infrastructure upgrades.
