CHARGES ALTERED IN MURDER CASE OF GRANDE PRAIRIE MAN

Charges against one of the men accused in the death of Adrian Snider have been withdrawn and replaced with manslaughter and accessory to murder.

25 year-old Snider was reported missing on March 31st. His remains were found by police in a rural area outside Grande Prairie on May 4th.

Patrick Decque, along with his younger brother Dominic Decque were charged with murder on May 4th, while a third suspect, 30 year-old Tommy Paul was arrested by Nanaimo RCMP and charged on May 6th. 21 year-old Courtney McQuinn of Campbell River, BC is also facing a count of accessory to murder after the fact. It's been confirmed that the Decque brothers knew the deceased, and were also previously





known to police.

PROVINCE GIVES BEATTON RIVER LANDSLIDE UPDATE

Following a landslide on Monday night due to heavy rain, the Peace River Regional District issued a warning for residents to stay away from the Beatton River.

Greig Bethel of the Ministry of Forests, Lands, and Natural Resource Operations confirmed that his ministry, as well as members from the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure, and the BC Oil and Gas Commission inspected the site on Tuesday, and says it is difficult to forecast when the slide will become inactive, as more slipping could occur any time.

According to the Ministry, flooding was minimal and impact to resource users and residents appears to be minimal overall. He adds that an immediately impacted landowner at the slide area has erected an electric fence adjacent to the site, to keep livestock safely away.

The Province is echoing the PRRD in asking people to stay away from the Beatton River at this time – from the slide area all the way down to the meeting of the Beatton and Peace rivers.

Bethel said that the Cecil Lake Bridge is well above the Beatton River and was not impacted by this event, but the bridge site is being monitored.



On Wednesday November 4th, Lake View Credit Union will be hosting two open Information Sessions on Registered Education Savings Programs (RESP) and the new, *one-time* \$1,200 British Columbia Training and Education Savings Grant (BCTES) in conjunction with the Credit Unions of BC.

This one-time \$1200 grant is for children born in 2007 or later. Families have three years, or until the day before the child's ninth birthday, to submit an application for the grant.

"No additional contributions are required to access the \$1,200 grant. The one-time grant of \$1,200 per eligible child will be deposited into an RESP upon approval of the application, making the task of saving for a child's education, and starting early, a simple process" says Glen Travers, Regional Branch Manager.

Parents can go into any Lake View Credit Union branch (Chetwynd, Tumbler Ridge or Dawson Creek) to open their child's RESP to obtain the BCTES. The additional \$1200 grant is available at any BC Credit Union.

The session in Chetwynd will be held at the Chetwynd Public Library, Nov 4th, beginning at 6. pm. The Tumbler Ridge session will be held at the branch, starting at 7 pm.
