





Chetwynd hockey fans gathered in numbers last weekend to take in the 7th Annual Norris Hoover Memorial Hockey Tournament at the Chetwynd Rec Centre, with 8 men's teams and 3 "old timer" teams competing for glory. Featuring players from the WHL, American Hockey League, Junior A, Junior B and Midget AAA leagues, the tournament took place over 3 days, highlighted by the annual memorial game, played by the Moberly Lakers and the Jackfish Leafs. Following a presentation of O Canada by the Little Giant Figure Skating Club, NHM Committee President Allie Auger and Master of Ceremonies Patrick Taylor gave a heartfelt, emotional speech honouring the men, Terry Norris and Brick Hoover, who the tournament is named for. In her speech, Auger noted the difficulties they faced in putting on this year's tournament due to the struggling economy making sponsors harder to come by, but due to some dedication and a bit of carryover from the previous year's funds, they were able to make it all happen. SAULTEAU SELECTS WIN 7TH ANNUAL NORRIS/HOOVER MEMORIAL HOCKEY TOURNAMENT

Seven months of preparation and planning go into bringing the tournament to town, with a crew of over 60 volunteers coming together to support local clubs. The event featured beer gardens all weekend, plus a Saturday night dance starring Calgary's Mayfield Band, who've previously opened for The Calgary Stampede. 450 dance tickets were sold with the proceeds going to help fund next year's tournament. Auger wanted to extend a special thank you to all the supporters, fans and teams participating in the tournament, emphasizing that "without their support this event would not be possible." Her speech also mentioned a fundraiser held in their beer gardens for Chris Leishman, who is currently battling cancer. Over the weekend \$1700 was raised to help support the Leishman family during this difficult time.

This tournament was noteworthy for being the first one to also be dedicated to someone else, Bowen Ethier, who passed away in 2015 but had played in the previous five tournaments. Asked about Ethier, Auger replied, "He was an amazing young man with a vibrant personality whose presence is deeply missed this year." The puck was dropped by Darian Marshall, son of Candice Norris and grandson of Terry Norris, and the game was underway. Before two minutes had passed the Moberly Lakers jumped out to an early lead, adding a second goal three minutes later that gave them a 2-0 lead at the half (all games had two 30-minute periods instead of three 20-minute periods). The domination by the Lakers, featuring Terry Norris' sons Kane and Kole, continued all game, putting up five goals in total with the Leafs only scoring in the last two minutes of regulation to break the shutout, ending the game 5-1.

After a full weekend of body checks and slap shots, it all came down to Sunday night's final between the Saulteau Selects and Weekend Warriors. The game started off defensively with a 1-1 tie until the Warriors took the lead with less than ten minutes left, giving them their only lead of the game until the Selects exploded for 3 goals in under six minutes to end the half at 4-2. Saulteau maintained control in the second half with two more goals, but the Warriors managed three goals of their own to come within one goal of tying it up. With under two minutes remaining the Warriors pulled their goalie in the hopes of igniting the offense with an extra man attack but some poor puck-handling led to the Selects finishing the game off with an empty net goal and a final score of 7-5. The teams then received their awards with the second place Warriors winning \$1500 and the champion Selects receiving medals, commemorative hats, the trophy and \$3000 as their reward for a hard-fought weekend on the ice. Earlier in the day the Moberly Lakers won \$750 in the third place game after defeating the Jackfish Leafs. The weekend's MVPs were Mike Lalonde from the Saulteau Selects and Brandon Campos from the Weekend Warriors with Brandon Gamble of the Moberly Lakers winning top goaltender.



MEET THE MAYOR

As spring approaches, the thoughts of Council frequently turn to polishing off the final details of capital plans and budget adjustments. We've just done that and I will share some of the more significant details with you.

The District of Chetwynd operates with four funds: Capital, Sewer Operating, Water Operating, and General Operating. All expenditures for administration and capital projects will be from one of these four funds.

Most of you are familiar with and concerned about increases to property taxes based on the value of your home or business. I will start with the General Operating Fund to which a 2% increase applies. There's probably not another house in town quite like the house that keeps you warm and dry – or priced quite the same as yours. That's why your property tax bill won't be quite the same as your neighbour's tax bill. But take a bit of courage from this: property tax increases will amount to approximately \$3 to \$4 per

month on the typical home. But don't hold me to it. Some properties are outliers – more expensive than the typical or less expensive than the typical. Some owners will pay a bit less and others will pay more.

Still in the General Operating Fund: improvements in the ability of your Fire Department to limit fire damage to your homes and other properties (mandated by outside agencies) will amount to approximately \$66,000 per year for this year and the two subsequent years. Council opted to acquire all the SCBA equipment this year instead of over three years and realize some savings in the modifications to the new fire truck. Operations, including salaries and costs of maintaining the community, will be similar to last vear's costs.

You will see increases in the Water and Sewer Operating Fund assessments. While the percent of the increases will cause you to take a second look, that second look should assure you that the dollar amount is very small. The Sewer Fund will increase between \$8 and \$25 per year, the Water Fund between \$3 and \$10 per year depending on your consumption. Sewer rates are calculated on your water consumption.

From the Capital Fund you can expect to see year five of a five-year road-improvement plan completed a year early with the rehabilitation of 51A NE, 44 Place NE and, funds permitting, 44A St. NE. You will also see the completion of the Chetwynd District Centre, the renovation to the Visitor Centre, and contributions to the Library renovation project.

Still in the Capital Fund, you have already noticed the prep work for the replacement of some Boulevard trees. This work will continue over the next years.

Of interest is the purchase of a new pumper truck for the Fire Department.

This is not a comprehensive listing of the totality of expenditures Council has authorized on behalf of the people of Chetwynd but it gives you a good sense of where the bulk of your tax funds will be used. Merlin Nichols, Mayor


