CHETWYND COUNCIL MEETING

On Monday, November 7, 2016, Chetwynd's regular council meeting began with a presentation from Dale Morgan from the Ministry of Aboriginal Relations and Reconciliation. The presentation was their first step to help engage and inform the public and shareholders more in the process of negotiations with the First Nations people of BC.

The Ministry of Aboriginal Relations and Reconciliation helps to engage in relations and partnerships with First Nations. After getting a good understanding of their needs, the Ministry develops strategies in the hopes to eventually establish and enter into an agreement both beneficial to the provinces interests as well as the First Nations, with respect to treaties already in place. After a short, informative presentation, Dale Morgan asked Greg Perrins up to the stand to answer a few questions from council. Councillor Laura Weisgerber asked about Site C land transfers. Perrins informed everyone that only Macleod Lake has entered into an agreement as of now and all others are under negotiations. The presentation finished with Greg Perrins informing the Council they will be back again with more in depth information about the negotiations, in particular the land parcel agreements.

The next presentation was from Julia Nelson on behalf of the Chetwynd Arts Council. She began with the request for a matching donation of \$4000 to that of the provincial grant they have applied for and hope to receive. The \$4000 from the District of Chetwynd will be added to the \$6399.00 grant they hope to receive from the government and it will go towards their operating costs for the year. Julia also described all the exciting things that will be happening between now and spring for the Chetwynd Arts Council. They received the go ahead to use the Tourist Info Centre on their shoulder season, which gave the Arts council the opportunity to hold their Annual Art Gala for more than one night. The Gala will be on display for an entire month, and they will also be holding workshops throughout the month as well. The Chetwynd Arts Council has been dreaming of this day, Julia says. Council will consider the request for funds and vote on it at a future meeting.

In other community news, Project North Pole plans are finalized for the year. Councillor Rochelle Galbraith informed everyone of the successful banner unveiling last week at the Legion, as well as 4 other banners that have been ordered. Councillor Galbraith has also been designated as the District's representative on a committee to look at the option of a renovated or perhaps new Library. If plans fall into place, a public referendum will be held sometime next year to discuss the options.

The meeting concluded with Mayor Nichols extending a public congratulations to the Chetwynd Employment Opportunities: Apply online at www.aw.ca Fire Department for their hard work and all they do for the community.

Until next spring.









Another Remembrance Day has come and gone as everyone took a moment of silence. The Veterans donned their uniforms in respect and appreciation for the sacrifices made by the men and women who fought for our country. But is the true significance of Remembrance Day slowing slipping away in the new generation of Canadians?

With the First World War a century behind us, the memories fade into history, and in a few more decades the second World War will do the same. The same emotional impact on those left behind seems
