





GRAD STUDENTS GET NEW SCHOLARSHIPS TO HELP BUILD THE BEST B.C.

Students in graduate-level degree programs at the University of British Columbia (UBC) will be able to focus more intently on research and innovation because of a \$6-million scholarship fund that will also help recruit and retain the province's brightest minds

"Graduate students at UBC are pushing the boundaries of research, while improving the quality of life for all British Columbians," said Melanie Mark, Minister of Advanced Education, Skills and Training. "This long overdue investment in scholarships will help recruit and retain more graduate talent, so we can build the best B.C. for everyone."

The merit-based graduate student scholarship funding from government will be administered by UBC, making 400 awards of \$15,000 each available for eligible domestic students. UBC is also leveraging this provincial funding to encourage donors to support graduate students. Donors will be invited, under UBC's Blue & Gold fundraising campaign, to add their own donations to benefit graduate students in Vancouver and the Okanagan.

"The University of British Columbia is an integral partner in developing the highly skilled graduates, and research, that our tech and innovation sector relies on to continue thriving and expanding B.C.'s economy," said Bruce Ralston, Minister of Jobs, Trade and Technology. "Our \$6-million scholarship investment will directly help grad students, so they can spend more energy focused on their innovative research."

The graduate scholarships are research focused, with an emphasis on science, technology, engineering and mathematics, as well as professional, Indigenous and regional programs.

This week you get a potpourri of bits and pieces, here a little, there a little, of information and ideas requiring some thought on my part and a little on yours. No! Contrary to popular opinion based on empirical visual evidence (so, how could we be wrong? Right?), they are not dead. They look dead; I agree with you who agree with me. I thought they were dead just like many of you thought. I've been urging Administration to have them replaced forthwith with living beings. But, according to expert opinion, I am wrong, again. They've been victimized by the Cottony Psyllid (Psyllopsis discrepans). Belonging to the family of insects sometimes called jumping plant lice, leaping over the sea, they have come to us from Europe. Next year the District of Chetwynd will have to ambush the little blighters before they can do their thing again. This year we'll call it a near-death experience with the light at the end of the tunnel, the only assurance that it doesn't have to happen again. We've learned our lesson, how to protect our trees against the pest. Oh, yes, the trees that have been hit in the boulevard are Manchurian Ash, a favorite of the jumping plant lice. But, contrary to visual perception, our Manchurian Ash are still living.

Conuma Coal is continuing to prosper and to share its prosperity with its neighbours. On July 9 the District of Chetwynd received another CA\$30,000 for a sweet total of CA\$230,000 since Conuma started operating the Wolverine and Brule Mines. You will be delighted to be reminded that these dollars have been placed in a special fund for special projects yet to be decided by Council. Willow Creek mine is being ramped up for production as you read this bit of literature. We take this opportunity to thank Conuma management and shareholders for their visionary approach to harvesting the natural resources of our region. We have also noted with appreciation the human resource, safety, and environmental measures Conuma is taking to ensure as far as humanly possible a long and productive life for the mines and an extended period of relative security for families and communities associated with them.

Seniors are a blessed treasure of the community experience. Happily, we have our share of them and they have their share of challenges (other than by lasting into that level of maturity, how does one get to be a senior?) Thanks to the generosity of Russ Young and his donation of crushed limestone to the Seniors' horseshoe pits and the contribution of District labour, tossing the horseshoes over the pins is once again a source of time-passing pleasure for seniors and aspiring seniors.

I think it was last week that I casually mentioned the work our District staff was doing on the flood-prevention front. This week I am free to tell of the \$700,000+ grant Chetwynd just received to be applied to very practical measures professionally designed to reduce the level of water in our cross-community streams during future heavy-rain events (that will strike us later – or sooner). Our thanks are due to our government departments that recognize a well-crafted proposal and respond in a timely manner. Work has already commenced on the design phase.

Those of you who must travel on 47th Ave. will be relieved to learn that IDL is making steady progress on the sewer project down under. Some challenges, not unexpected, involving more ground water than desirable have been encountered but the arm-chair politicians in our midst will be glad (or not) to learn that the project is on time and on budget at this stage.

While the thought of budgets is still on your minds: the water-treatment project has come in significantly under budget so we are asking the Ministry for permission to use excess funds to upgrade the high-lift water station electrical equipment, a part of the Water Treatment Plant system. Maybe; maybe no; we'll see. In either case, we are more than thankful for the support we continue to get from our senior governments.

And keep watch for the date of the ribbon cutting for the Water Treatment Plant to be announced sometime in August. Plan to join us.

Oh, by the way, here is a word for the pushers, the drivers, the strivers, the climbers: "know your limits – then ignore them" (John Mason).




