

MEET THE MAYOR

March 17, 2017

Have you ever been lost? I know I have. Maybe you've been lost driving in a strange city, hiking in the wilderness, or like my wife and I, who inadvertently bicycled into the wrong neighborhood in the downtown east side of Vancouver on our tenth anniversary. Moving to a new community can bring the same uncertainty. Imagine, you are uprooted from everything that's familiar to you, and dropped into a new surrounding. Where do you go? What is there to do? How do you meet people? Simple things that we, long term residents, take for granted can be unfamiliar to new residents. Where to get prescriptions filled, book clubs, activities for children, or cooking classes. Did

some just think "Cooking Classes?" Yes, there is a Cooking Class in Chetwynd. Where do we as citizens, established and new, find out about such programs? At the Chetwynd Public Library!

There is a new program in town. The Chetwynd Community Ambassador Program. There are many people who move to Chetwynd that can benefit from an indoctrination into our community. In recent discussions with the Library Director, I have learned that the original function of a library was not to lend books. Many of us who have raised children in Chetwynd I'm sure appreciate the abundance of free programs at the library. 

PROVINCE TO INVEST \$500-MILLION OVER THE NEXT FOUR YEARS FOR SENIORS

\$500-million will be invested over the next four years to improve care for seniors within British Columbia by The Province. The Province says that this funding from the Ministry of Health will help health care authorities to reach a consistent average of 3.36 direct-care hours per resident per day for both publicly administered and contracted residential-care facilities. B.C. will also be helping to meet the increase of hours by working with health authorities and industry to hire close to 1,500 additional staff, including health-care assistants, nurses, occupational therapists and physiotherapists. The government says these investments were made possible due to the increase in the Ministry of Health budget for 2017.


