Remembrance Day has been recognized in Canada since 1931. However, the occasion was initially known as Armistice Day, and was exclusively a celebration of the end of World War I. Here's what Remembrance Day is all about today and how you can celebrate it.

Remembrance Day is celebrated annually on November 11 to honour the contributions of all military service members who gave their lives defending our nation. Similar commemorative events, such as Decoration Day in June and Paardeberg Day in February, were held before World War I. However, the scale of the Great War and the extensive human cost incurred by the conflict led to the adoption of a single celebration.

Canada's armed forces have since been involved in a number of conflicts, including World War II, the Korean War, the Gulf War and the war in Afghanistan, as well as a long list of peacekeeping operations across the globe. Veterans of these wars are likewise honoured on Remembrance Day.

Here are some ideas to help honour our veterans and their bravery:

- Wear the poppy over your heart
 - Observe two minutes of silence at 11 a.m. on November 11
- Attend a Remembrance Day ceremony in your region
- Speak with veterans, or listen to interviews with them
- Learn more about Canada's memorial monuments
- Visit a war museum or memorial in your region
- Learn more about Canada's involvement in a conflict, peacekeeping mission or humanitarian effort

Winter Parking on District Roads Information Everyone Should Know



Winter is upon us and with it comes heavy snow falls. The District of Chetwynd is committed to keeping all our roads safe for all citizens and therefore any vehicles parked in a manner that interferes with effective snow removal may be removed. The Streets and Traffic Regulation Bylaw # 909, 2009 section 5.13: Obstruction of Motor Vehicles No vehicle shall be left standing or parked:

(iv) in a position that causes it to interfere with the construction, improvement, maintenance, alterations, extension, widening, marking, or repair of or snow removal from a highway.

As per the District of Chetwynd's Snow Clearing Policy, snow plowing will commence after 50mm of snow accumulation, roads will be plowed on a priority basis and residential streets will be plowed within 48 hours following the subsidence of the snowfall. If vehicles are parked on residential streets following a snow fall, the road will not be cleared until all vehicles have been removed and it has been deemed safe by the District.

TRANSFORM ANY ROOM INTO A HOME THEATRE



CELEBRATING SKILLED TRADES DURING APPRENTICESHIP RECOGNITION MONTH

Quick Facts

This is the first Apprenticeship Recognition Month in British Columbia; previously, it was celebrated as Apprenticeship Week.

There are nearly 39,000 apprenticeships:

10% of apprentices are women.

8% of apprentices are Indigenous.

There are more than 6,900 youth trades program participants.

B.C. is home to over 100 trades, 51 of which are nationally recognized Red Seal.

ITA expects to fund over 21,000 apprenticeship training seats this year at public and private institutions.

Since 2018, ITA has signed eight memoranda of understanding with Indigenous organizations across the province to increase training and employment opportunities in their home communities
