Also returning to council will be Mel Deck, who received 394 votes, and Laura Weisgerber, who received 374 votes. Outgoing Mayor Merlin Nichols ran for a seat on council, but was



Mayor's Report October 26, 2018

Dear people of my home town, it has been a wonderful 17 years for me and the best jobs of my short life. You who desired to serve as Mayor and Councillors have desired a good thing and I trust that the trust the people of Chetwynd have placed in you will be well performed. Congratulations on your success.

That said, voters of Chetwynd, don't expect overwhelming changes and unusual good times to descend on our home town because of the change in governance. It will continue to be the regular carrying out of routine governance duties in a professional manner that distinguishes the great local government from the mediocre. The Mayor and Council that understands its governance role and the natural boundaries that must exist between governance and administration will be the governing body that does its job as it should. Blessings on you.

Actually, I am expecting great things from this Mayor and Council because great things must happen soon for the peace and prosperity of our home town and I trust that you have elected a Mayor and Council that will rise to the challenges. Over the past months I have referred several times to the pending issues related to Caribou Recovery. The Quintette and Narraway caribou herds have been named as threatened under the Species at Risk Act (SARA). On May 4, 2018 the Federal Minister of Environment declared they are facing imminent threats to their recovery. (Look out your window to the south and you will see the Quintette territory. Narraway territory surrounds Tumbler Ridge.) The Federal Government requires British Columbia to take appropriate action to remedy the situation with respect to these named caribou herds. Failing to act to the satisfaction of the Federal Government will result in an order for action by the Federal Government.

This we want to avoid.

At all costs? Well, no.

I have repeatedly stressed to our governments that the human species shares territory with all other species in the region. Our challenge is to learn to share the territory respectfully, acknowledging that human needs and rights are at least as important as those of the caribou and may, indeed, take precedence. (I have always maintained that If I meet a bear on the trail and it is either him or me, it ain't gonna be me; but as a vegetarian, I won't go out of my way to shoot a bear — or a caribou, for that matter.)

Lest our governments forget, I respectfully remind you that Victoria, Ottawa, and most other great cities in our great country were once pristine forests, homes to birds and beasts of countless varieties that no longer can live on our streets – perhaps with the exception of the covote.

I also remind you that, not to single out any particular city, but to single out one, Vancouver in Beautiful British Columbia was once a primeval forest of giant trees, since clear cut to provide living space for human beings who pushed the bears and foxes and ungulates a little farther back into the mountains.

Our northern communities also, urban and rural, occupy lands that once upon a time were pristine wilderness. Then the people came and came and came. Some became farmers and cleared the forests for harvests of grain and cattle, others by nature were loggers and harvested the woodlands for the boards and beams used to build the houses in cities like Victoria and Ottawa. Others became merchants, teachers, health-care workers, mechanics, drivers and all the other countless services that make our communities home sweet home.

We will not easily give up our homes built over generations by blood, sweat, and even tears. But that is what some people advocate for the sake of preserving a herd of caribou. But let's not be hypocritical. You also live in houses made of wood from our forests, heated by gas from the North East wells, lighted by the latent energy of flowing water captured behind massive earth-filled dams, and use transit, either private or public, the steel frames of which are 50% coal from open-pit mines. Oh yes, look hard and you will find 100 tons of met coal from an open-pit mine in every eco-friendly wind tower. Think again before you shut us down.

You need us. We need you.

And all of us need the animals, birds, fish, insects, and flora that the Creator placed on this round globe for us to manage.

I think there is something here for all of us to understand.

Oh, by the way, calculate the loads of met coal that must be mined every year from our hills just to keep North America in fingernail clippers.

Investigations Continue on Enbridge pipeline Explosion,

Residents Asked to Limit Usage of Natural Gas Investigators from the Transportation Safety Board and the National Energy Board continue to investigate the natural gas explosion that occurred just north of Prince George on October 9th. The explosion has been deemed "not of a suspicious nature", but the cause is still unknown.

The 36" Enbridge pipe was severed and badly damaged in the explosion. Crews expect the line to be fully repaired by mid November. A secondary 30" pipeline that runs parallel to the damaged line was immediately depressurized after the incident but after a close inspection was

reinstated days later, only running at 80% capacity.

While the weather is mild, natural gas customers have been asked to limit their usage, in an attempt to ration the lowered supply. Reduced natural gas supplies could see levels between 20 and 50% of normal levels throughout the winter due to the incident. Lower Mainland natural gas residents, universities and industries have already cut their usage since the explosion by 20%. Cuts are being made right down into the U.S. where they are also asking customers in Washington state to help conserve natural gas and electricity because of the pipeline rupture and the impact it has on the U.S. gas supply.

Fortis BC said in a statement they have been working with TransCanada to maximize output with their Southern Crossing pipeline that feeds into the Interior from Alberta and are actively working with industrial customers to optimize their energy use — keeping them running while minimizing system impacts.

In a statement from Fortis BC it was said "We recognize that in some parts of B.C. it may be impractical to turn off thermostats due to cold weather. Even turning the temperature down as much as possible and reducing hot water use and other natural gas usage will help."

Combined, the two pipes supply 85% of all natural gas used province wide. There are just over a million customers across the province, who are using natural gas from the Lower Mainland to Northern B.C. and about 70% of those customers could be impacted.

Anthrax confirmed in Fort St. John area livestock



Naturally acquired anthrax has been determined to be the cause of death of 13 livestock on a farm near Fort St. John.

It is believed that the animals caught the disease from exposure to dormant anthrax spores in the soil of a feeding site that is no longer in use. The bacteria can remain inactive in soil for many years, and it is known to naturally occur in livestock in Northern Alberta and the Canadian Prairies.

Public health officials have been in contact with individuals who might have been in contact with the source of the infection, and are following up with those people in order to assess their health, however, it is believed that the general public is not at risk. - story courtesy of PeaceFM


