A 4-Year Old Boy Who Went Missing Near Mackenzie, B.C Has Been Found "Safe and Sound" After Spending 30 Hours in The Bush.

Cpl. Madonna Saunderson, media spokeswoman for the RCMP's North District, told News "He has been found safe and sound and been reunited with his mom." It was wet in the region overnight and temperatures dipped to single-digits Celsius. The boy was taken to hospital for a medical examination but is said to be nothing more than cold dehydrated and hungry.

The 4 year old Hazard-Benoit was sleeping in a van on Saturday while on an outing with his mother and her friend, who were picking berries at Lions Lake, 170 kilometres north of Prince George.

George Hazard-Benoit was spotted early Sunday evening by an RCMP aircraft. The aircraft, which had not been involved in the search earlier in the day due to weather, then alerted an RCMP dog handler on the ground and the boy was located by the tracker dog.

According to search and rescue crews, his mother was 10 metres away from him harvesting berries, when she returned to the van, the boy was gone. That was at 12:30 p.m. on Saturday.

His father, Kristopher Benoit, who is separated from the child's mother and has primary custody, said he was notified at 4 p.m. that his son was missing in the bush.

Police and search and rescue teams from Mackenzie, Prince George, Fort St. John, Fort St. James and Chetwynd all joined the search for the boy, along with police dog services and air support. Over 300 volunteers gathered to assist in the search, and with the help of search and rescue teams and volunteers, this little boy was thankfully found safe and sound.

BC Coroners Service Reports Decrease in Illicit Drug Toxicity Deaths

The BC Coroners Service reports that the amount of illicit drug deaths has gone down in the province.

According to the Coroner's report, in June 2019, there were 73 suspected illicit drug toxicity deaths, which is a 35% decrease from the number of deaths in June 2018 and a 15% decrease from May 2019. The Coroners Service also reports that during the first half of this year, there were 538 deaths due to illicit drugs, which is a decrease of approximately 30% from the same time period in 2018.

The report also notes that in four out of every five illicit drug toxicity deaths in 2018 and 2019, fentanyl was detected. Additionally, no deaths were reported at supervised consumption sites or drug overdose prevention sites.

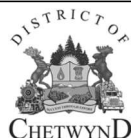

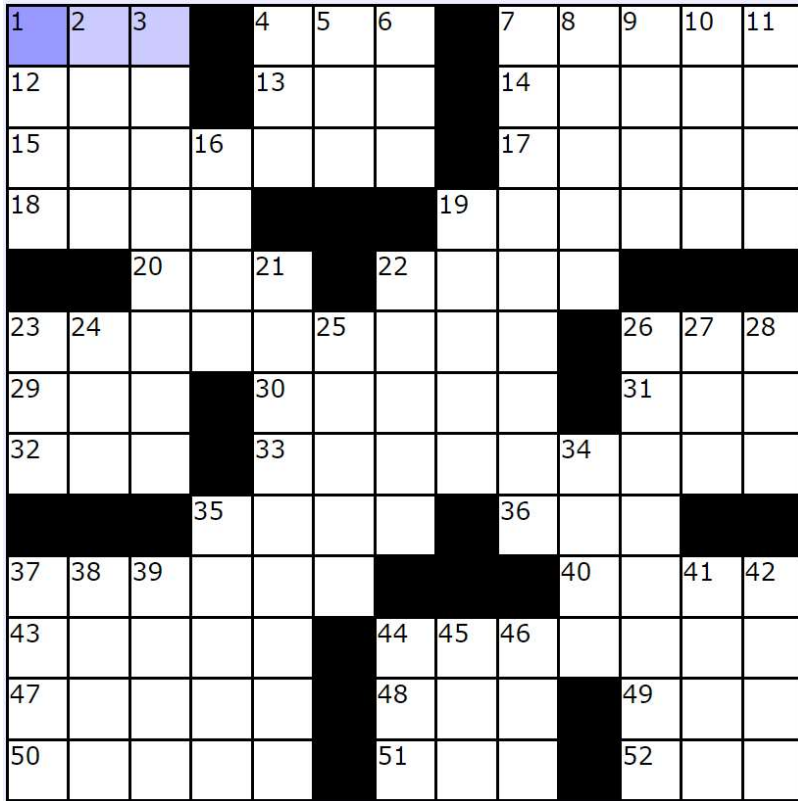

3 WAYS TO SUPPORT A LOVED ONE WITH MENTAL ILLNESS

Faced with a loved one with mental illness, family members are often searching for what they can do to help and support their loved ones.

Fortunately, Dr. Randall White, medical director of Vancouver Community Mental Health Services, has some tips for people in this position.

Find out what medical information you can access. Generally, patients have a right to keep their medical information private. But if a person becomes certified under the B.C. Provincial Mental Health Act, then medical staff can typically share some details with family members to assist in treatment.

Communicate that you care and want to help. Let your loved one know that you're there to be supportive. Keep conversations positive. Sometimes a person may act in a way that compromises their relationships, but it's important to continue to let them know that you are there to help. Families are a crucial support in helping a patient succeed in maintaining their wellness.

Be willing to set boundaries. At some point your loved one may begin to exhibit behaviours or thoughts that are too challenging for you to manage or understand. You can still let them know you care, but setting boundaries is important in helping you continue providing support. Find ways to build your own support system through supportive family members, mental health counselling or a local support group. By helping yourself, you can better help your loved one.

Tenant Relations Officer (Full-time Permanent Position)

The Tenant Relations Officer is responsible for establishing and maintaining positive relations and communications between SFN Tenants and the SFN housing Department. The TRO ensures that all tenants are adequately accommodated within the guidelines of the SFN housing policy.

The Tenant Relations Officer would be tasked with responsibilities such as:

- Assist and support Saulteau members who are tenants with an understanding of the housing policy, the tenant agreement, and the responsibility of the Nation and the Tenant
- Assisting with the completion of, intake, and processing of applications for housing; this includes entering applications into a software program
- Receiving and processing applications for tenancy
- Identify and allocate units to approved applicants when units are available
- Maintain tenant files by ensuring that all documents pertinent to the house and tenant are filed accordingly
- Work closely with Finance department on payroll deductions, rental arrears agreements, and invoicing
- Ensure rent receipts are collected and organized in a timely manner
- Ensure tenants maintain compliance with SFN housing policy
- Daily communication with maintenance department to ensure housing issues are addressed in a timely manner

Homemaker (Full-time Temporary Position)

The purpose of the Homemaker is to ensure personal cleanliness, household needs, and services are available to clients who have been assessed by the Home and Community Care Program as having these needs.

Following the home care schedule set forth by the supervisor, the homemaker would be tasked with responsibilities such as:

- Vacuuming, sweeping, and mopping floors
- General cleaning of kitchen surfaces and appliances
- Washing dishes
- Cleaning and sanitizing bathrooms, including toilets
- Tidying and organizing rooms
- Wash walls (not higher than your reach)
- Wash windows
- Monthly deep cleaning of appliances and cupboards
- Removing garbage and recycling
- Laundry
