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Seaweed- A Healthy Alternative Feed for Livestock

Gassy cows are incredibly bad for the environment. While many will laugh at that statement it couldn't be more true. Cow flatulence exudes methane, a gas that damages the atmosphere and contributes to global warming. Cows methane emissions account for 88% of Canada's agricultural emissions and Methane has 36 times the global warming potential of carbon dioxide (Co2). Seaweed can reduce these emissions by more than 70%, helping this natural gas-reliever catch the attention of the Canadian government.



A specific enzyme in the human stomach digests carbohydrates in seaweed. So Scientists decided to check for the same reaction in a cow's stomach to determine if it can be used as feed and potentially biofuel.

Many places around the world have already tapped into the many benefits of seaweed. It's actually a very large, lucrative industry in Asia, not just for feeds but for other products, as well, like cosmetics, thickeners, and more.

On top of the gas emissions and all around good digestive properties, there's some species of seaweed that can grow up to one metre per day. You don't need arable land, you don't need fresh water to culture it, you don't need fertilizer, this makes it an amazing bio resource. There is only one problem- Seaweed is hard to harvest, so a wide commercial market for livestock feed is still far off, but a promising future for farmers, livestock, and cutting greenhouse gasses in Canada.

While red seaweed found off the coast of Australia was found to cut emissions the most by almost 99%, brown and green seaweeds still have amazing properties. With the world having 1.5 billion cows and their flatulence releasing 3.1 gigatonnes of methane into our atmosphere, this change of feed could eliminate a lot of Canada's greenhouse gas emissions and potentially help with climate change.

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KELSEY'S CHRONICLE

Mars-colonization was merely a vision but has now become that much more a reality when Elon Musk's multi planetary plans have been put to paper, SpaceX's billionaire founder and CEO Elon Musk published a plan earlier this year in June, where he unveiled a report titled "Making Humanity a Multi-Planetary Species." This report will help others see Musk's visions,

but will also help serve as an important reference for future studies and planning.

Musk's Mars vision centres around a reusable rocket-and-spaceship combo that he's fittingly named the Interplanetary Transport System (ITS). With this system, both the booster and spaceship will be powered by SpaceX's Raptor engine, which is still in development and construction stages. The Raptor engine is said to be three times stronger than the Merlin engines that power the company's Falcon 9 rocket.

The rocket booster will host over 40 raptor engines, making it by far the most powerful rocket in history

The interplanetary transport system (ITS) rockets will launch the spaceships to Earth's orbit, then come back down for a landing using pinpoint accuracy, approximately 20 minutes later. Musk suggests the accuracy will actually put the

booster right back on the launch stand.

Each rocket booster will be designed to fly about 1000 times in its lifespan and will also fly alongside fuel tankers, launched to help fuel rockets in orbit. Each ITS ship would likely be able to make 12- 15 deep space journeys and each fuel tanker could potentially fly to earth orbit just over 100 times. Reusability is key to making mars colonization affordable, dropping projected costs from 10 billion per person to only \$200,000.

The eventual plan for Musk and SpaceX is to have more than 1000 spaceships, carrying about 100 people each, leaving earth's orbit during one of these windows where mars and earth align, about once every 26 months.

With the way things are falling into place, Elon Musk suggests within 50-100 years there could be a colony of roughly 1 million people on Mars. With everything in place, ITS spaceships could begin flying to Mars in just over 10 years time.

Musk mentions in his report the transparency that there is a good chance they will not succeed, but also recounts on the progress they have made over the past 2 decades.

MAYOR'S REPORT

From the resort city of Whistler, site of the 2018 Union of British Columbia Municipalities annual convention: I wish I was home. Indeed! Whistler is a beautiful and confusing community designed to grab the visitor's attention and keep her or him lost as in a maze as he or she moves from venue to venue to attend the various meetings with Ministries and plenary sessions. But worry not; there are many opportunities to spend your spare time or cash.

Beautifully designed and artistically laid out, Whistler is a busy place even in the rain with hundreds of people, tourists, I assume, strolling the streets and malls in search of a sight or a site. And the city location can't be a distraction. Two hours out of Vancouver in a bowl among mountain peaks, people will come even in the rain.

But we delegates, several thousand of us, were not there for the views or the malls, the sights or the sites. Our work started at seven in the morning and propelled us through the days. I had the opportunity to attend three industry breakfasts (no comment on the food), one for mining, one for gas, and one for forestry. Speakers included the Ministers of the assorted industries and leaders in the same.

The speakers at the gas breakfast assured us that industry is closer now than it has ever been to a Final Investment Decision on LNG. I will leave you to interpret the meaning of that assurance and the implications for the North East and for Chetwynd. The big, sometimes unspoken, concern for all industries is still the uncertainty surrounding Caribou Recovery. However, I believe we are making some progress toward a resolution on the processes of recovery.

I cannot say much at this time about our activities on this file at the conference except that representatives from Chetwynd, Tumbler Ridge, and the Peace River Regional District met with responsible Ministers and following that meeting, with Ministry staff, to discuss our ideas and proposals – with some hopeful progress. I also arranged a meeting between available Councillors and industry leaders to plan future action.

The policy sessions are some of the most interesting events at the conference. At these sessions proposed resolutions are presented, argued, passed, or defeated. Chetwynd had three resolutions on the floor: one on Caribou Recovery, one on changes to our ambulance service, and one on pre-emptive action to reduce the threat of flooding during heavy rain events.

As the co-sponsor with the Peace River Regional District of the resolution on Caribou Recovery, I had to juggle a couple of meetings to be at the microphone to argue the case. It was not given that it would be approved. The level of opposition to reasonable proposals is surprising or not surprising depending on your point of view. One delegate opposed the resolution "vehemently" (his word) and urged the assembly to do likewise. Many did oppose. Mayor McPherson of our sister District of Tumbler Ridge came to the rescue as my time was expired and successfully concluded the defense of our position.

As the final two resolutions do not come to the floor until tomorrow morning I cannot know now how they will fare.

Of course there are unmeasurables for the convention that are significant even if they can't be weighed or priced to everyone's satisfaction. We meet and chat with delegates from communities across the province upon whose ideas we will meditate over the months to come. Many of these ideas will quietly mould our thinking and shape the policies we will adopt as Mayor and Council. Little by little, we all get to live in better communities.

In the meantime, I'd like to embed an idea in the minds of our youth. You are the generation that is going to be running this good land when guys like me are no more. Did you ever think of getting into public office? Why not start preparing? The next election is only four years away.

Oh, by the way, said the ancient sage: "He who is slothful in his work is a brother to him who is a great destroyer."

What specific qualities do you possess that will make you an ideal candidate for council?

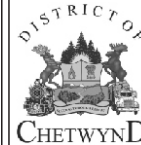
