#### CHEWYND COUNCIL MEETING

The District of Chetwynd held their regular council meeting on October 2nd at the Municipal Hall. All councillors were in attendance but Mayor Merlin Nichols was absent, and Councillor Deck acted as Mayor for the meeting.

The meeting began with a presentation from Chris Montgomery of Canadian Association of Petroleum Producers. Mr. Montgomery's presentation was to inform Council of their current condition of markets, the challenges they face, concerns about NAFTA, and reducing their carbon footprint.

CAPP represents large and small producer companies and haS over 70 members that produce 80% of Canada's natural gas and crude oil. Chris mentioned the importance of staying competitive in these markets to attract investment and open ourselves up to new foreign and domestic markets. He mentioned concerns about carbon pricing and the affects on the market. He also noted that not all areas in BC are likely to come back equally and producers will be focussing on highest value resource. This will include areas around Fort Nelson and Dawson Creek.

Don Pettit of Peace Energy Cooperative was the next to present. His presentation was to entice the District of Chetwynd to consider the benefits of solar power. Peace Energy Cooperative is based out of Dawson Creek and was a key player in BC's first wind project, the Bear Mountain Wind Park. They are a for-profit cooperative designed to provide financial return to their member investors and have more than 489 members. He went over the benefits of going solar with the biggest reason being that it fights climate change by reducing your carbon footprint. Additionally, the cost of solar has dropped 80% over the last 5 years and grid-tie has been streamlined by BC Hydro.

Mr. Pettit went over the project they're in the midst of in Hudson Hope, who has just received a grant of over 1 million to help complete their solar project.





#### **CHEWYND COUNCIL MEETING**

This solar project will help Hudson's Hope see a huge decrease in their hydro bill. In some cases, if you create more power than you use with your solar panels, BC Hydro will pay you for the extra power your solar has created. Solar power is helping many areas in the North, including Dawson Creek, Fort St. John, Mile 108, Charlie Lake, and Hudson's Hope. With our extended daylight in the summer months, our region is considered a plentiful solar resource, the best in the province.

Mr. Pettit asked council to consider a "community scan," which would provide them with more information on which buildings would benefit from solar and also an estimate on the cost of installation. He stressed that there are several grants available for municipalities looking to go solar and several more grants coming available on the horizon.

Council moved on to the first, second and third readings on the bylaw for tax exempt buildings in town. Council then made a motion to designate Mayor and one council member to attend the Climate Leadership Institute in Richmond in early November.

Councillor Pfanner gave a brief update on the Northern Health Steering Committee's progress and Councillor Galbraith announced that the District of Chetwynd would donate \$100 to the Junior Dragon's Den competition in 2018.

An informal public input session was opened for discussion regarding a second application from Dave and Ron Milner and Lorne Waldie for 150 more beds to be added to their original application of 150 that was approved on September 5th's council meeting.

The first to get up and speak in opposition was Mr. Bailey of Lakeview Inns and Suites. He was there to ask council to consider delaying their decision to see how the first set of camps affect the hotel vacancies in town.

Terry Halliday stood up and spoke of his rental properties and how he was full at the moment but may see some vacancies when the camps open. He was questioned if any of his tenants work for the companies that will be using the camps where he answered that he was uncertain but maybe 8 of them.

Dave Milner got up and spoke on behalf of his camp project stressing that there is nowhere for hundreds of workers to get a hot meal at early hours in the morning or bagged lunches, additionally that there will be a huge influx in workers over the next few months that will not have anywhere to stay.

Tasha Sheppard of the Pomeroy Inn and Suites and a representative from Fort. St. John spoke in opposition but also spoke of the brick and mortar incident that put Fort St. John in hot water after they built over 1100 rooms of hotels throughout the city for Site-C that never saw any Site C workers. She went on to say that here in Chetwynd they have good vacancy rates at the moment that fluctuate from morning to night but would likely see a decrease if another 150 bed camp is built on top of the over 400 beds that are already in construction.

Carmen Westgate of the Riverhouse Restaurant and Pine Cone Inn spoke in favour of the Flite Oilfield camp adding an extra 150 beds. She mentioned that her staff are over worked and her hotel couldn't accommodate one more person even if they wanted to. She is fully booked and has a waiting list at this time. She mentioned that her businesses are not the only ones over worked and understaffed, as many other establishments made their situation clear at a different meeting held the week prior.

Council moved on to the decision where they came to the conclusion, by vote, that they would hold off on an approval at this time.






