SIGNS THAT YOUR CHILD IS BEING BULL

(NC) Bullying is an issue that takes many different forms and effects Canadian boys and girls of all ages. Much of the attention in recent years has focused on how the development of social and mobile platforms affects the bullying landscape. Canadian children are now connected to their peers at all hours of the day and bullies are able to target victims through the computer or cellular phone. While these trends continue to get mainstream attention, it is important to remember that often times bullying starts at school and in the playground.


The relationships that are introduced at school set the groundwork for bullying to develop through these other platforms. Verbal and physical are two forms of bullying that predominantly occur at our schools. The short-term results of bully are damaging as children suffer physical and emotional trauma, however the effect of bullying extends beyond present issues as victims can develop psychological effects that carry into adulthood.

"The impact of bullying on a child's social and cognitive development cannot be understated. Targets of bullying are more likely to develop social anxiety, depression, and self-esteem problems," says Ross Murray, a Group Psychology Researcher. "Interpersonal issues also arise as individuals may struggle to assert themselves in social situations and produce more emotional reactions in everyday life.

Teachers and school faculty are vigilant to the signs of bullying on school grounds, however as the landscape for bullying continues to develop it is important for families to know the signs and what to look for. Common signs include:

- Lack of interest in school work and grades begin to suffer.
- Coming home with unexplained cuts, bruises, and scratches.
- Becoming hesitant to go to school and developing different excuses to miss days.
- Trouble sleeping.
- Appearing anxious at home and lacking self-confidence.
- Does not express interest in participating in after school activities, organized sport, or events with friends.

These are just a few potential signs that a child is suffering from bullying. It is important to engage with your child and develop a level of transparency where they feel comfortable

STRING OF FIRES IN HUDSON'S HOPE

In Hudson's Hope, the RCMP is investigating what they believe to be a string of suspicious fires.

It begins with a jogger coming across a small grass fire near Canyon Drive on April 21, 2015 around 5:30 a.m., according to Cpl. Dave Tyreman. Shortly after, approximately 400 meters away, the same person discovered a plastic jug with gasoline soaked paper inside that was on fire.

Then the Hudson's Hope Fire Department received a call of a structure fire in the Signal Hill area on April 23, 2015 at 1:28 a.m. – which Cpl. Tyreman says is still under investigation

The Hudson's Hope RCMP is reaching out to the public for any possible witnesses to these fires. If you saw anyone in either of these two areas hanging around or acting suspicious prior to the time the fires were reported, contact the Hudson's Hope RCMP at 250 783 5241.





SITE C FACES CHALLANGES

It could still be months away, but a B.C. Supreme Court justice must now make a decision on two court cases presented last week challenging the provincial government approval of the Site C dam project.

The week opened with the Peace Valley Landowners Association contending the province broke the law by ignoring a portion of the recommendations that came from the project's joint review panel.

Then at week's end, a trio of First Nations, whose traditional territories would be impacted by the Peace River dam construction, went before the same Supreme Court justice to argue the province's environmental approval of the project should be squashed because the decision making process was flawed and infringes on their treaty rights.

"We're not saying no to the energy, we're saying no to the structure of this valley," says Chief Roland Willson of the West Moberly First Nation. "What they're proposing with Site C is the last piece of the Peace Valley that we have left there, and it's a critical area."

"There is legal precedence saying that they can't justify what they're doing; they have options that they can do."



Meantime, B.C. Hydro has laid out the land and cash being offered to the West Moberly, Prophet River, and McLeod Lake First Nations and says it would deliver \$6.5 million upfront and another \$42 million over 70 years.

The land offer translates into a third of the 6,500 hectares that would be either submerged or occupied by the dam, the generating station and the reservoir. It also intended to address the findings of the joint review panel regarding the impact of the project on First Nations' hunting, fishing, trapping and other traditional activities.

Still pending are the PVLA and the Treaty 8 Federal Court challenges, along with those from two Alberta First Nations

— slated to come in July after Hydro begins dam construction.
