Over a 10-year period Daphne served as a Social Services/Recreation Coordinator for 6 different low-income, government-subsidized, multi-family housing developments privately managed by Interstate Realty Management Company as part of their comprehensive Social Services and Drug Prevention Program

Daphne was responsible for facilitating and supervising the H.U.D. – initiated Safe Neighborhood Action Plan (S.N.A.P.) and the H.U.D. – initiated Neighborhood Networks Computer Training Center.

As S.N.A.P. Coordinator, Daphne supervised a comprehensive Social Services program. In addition to serving Haddington Townhouses, a 125-unit, Multifamily housing development, she was also responsible for providing services to the surrounding community. Supervising more than 20 employees and countless community volunteers, she collaborated with and established partnerships with more than 36 publicly- and privately-funded organizations to secure resources and services for residents of the

Haddington community. She also worked cooperatively with local law enforcement and political officials to address crime in a more concerted way.

Daphne facilitated Job Fairs, Youth Programs, a Summer Lunch and Recreation program, Anti-Drug rallies, Unity Day events centered on anti-drug and anti-violence as well as educational themes and many other services.

Secured grant funding in excess of \$180,000 dollars from various public and private agencies on behalf of the residents and the surrounding communities.

Developed educational programs for children and adults utilizing community resources:

- Developing a Resident Organization to address social problems and provide motivation for positive social change.
- Organized, edited and produced a monthly resident newsletter.
- Facilitated Life Skills Training and activities for residents and teens.
- Facilitated an Abstinence Education program sponsored by the Department of Health and Human Services for teens.

Responsible for:

- Organizing and implementing activities that resulted in the reduction of vandalism, crime and drug activity within the complex and surrounding community
- Increased resident involvement and concern for developing a safe and positive environment for themselves and their children.

From October 1998-August 2001, Daphne worked in the capacity as Supervisor for the VISTA program. As a result of her innovative and the dedicated facilitation of the VISTA Work Plan, Haddington Townhouses was the recipient of the prestigious "Community of Quality" Award for Best Turn Around Development in the country in August of 2000.

Daphne was successful at obtaining more than \$500,000 in funding from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development through the New Approach Anti-Drug Grant.

This award is presented by the National Assisted Housing Management Association (NAHMA). She was solely responsible for writing and submitting a Goal/Work Plan.

Responsibilities also included daily supervision of 2 VISTA volunteers, developing and implementing a comprehensive Social Services plan. She also regularly assessed the impact of the program.

As Supervisor for the Neighborhood Networks Computer Training Center, Daphne was responsible for the daily operation of the Computer Center. This included:

- Hiring of staff, overseeing expenditures and ensuring that equipment and curriculum was efficient
- Recruitment of students
- Tracking progress and providing supportive services.
- Liaison between students and other social services agencies
- Assisted students with referrals for day care
- Emergency food, clothing and housing
- Job Placement assistance and Life Skills Training
- Offering a GED program

At the end of each six month training, residents would be certified and participated in graduations and celebrations honoring and recognizing them as students.
