

Weekly tasks - week commencing 8th of June

Hello Oak Class! I was so impressed with how hard you worked on your last set of tasks - I will be making a display in class of a mixture of your work and our work - so please keep sending through your lovely photos!

As per last week - you can do these tasks in any order - or at any time that suits you - but in case you are worried about how to arrange your day - it could look something like this:

Task	1 hour
Reading eggs, spelling shed or sumdog	30 mins
Reading	20 mins

Not necessarily in that order and make sure to take breaks - don't do it all at once!

Your week might look something like this:

Monday	Task 1	Sum dog	Read to an adult
Tuesday	Task 2	Reading eggs	Read to an adult
Wednesday	Task 5 (zoom)	Spelling shed	Read to an adult
Thursday	Task 3	Sum dog	Read to an adult
Friday	Task 4	Spelling shed - spelling words	Read to an adult

If you manage to do all 3 of those things then you will be doing an amazing job, if you only manage 1 or 2 then don't worry - you might choose to do more than 1 of the tasks set on one day and then just do online work the next!

Reminders/other information

- I just want to remind you about oxford owls - they have a wealth a reading books for you to read online, as does reading eggs.
- There will be tasks set on reading eggs, spelling shed and sumdog.

- You can email me with questions or concerns.
- If in reception - you can upload videos to tapestry (I know they can be a pain to send via email!)
- There will now be just 1 session a week on zoom for children in reception and year 1 who are not attending school. At the moment this will be on Wednesday's at 1pm.
 - I will upload a daily video of me reading a story.
