

# Bunny Love

## Figure Tutorial



# What You Need

- ♡ Light beige sugarpaste
- ♡ Small amount of light pink sugarpaste
- ♡ Small amount of white sugarpaste
- ♡ Water
- ♡ Fine paintbrush
- ♡ Black gel colour
- ♡ Cocktail Sticks
- ♡ Scalpel/X-Acto knife
- ♡ Dresden tool



# Page 1



Take a ball of light beige sugarpaste and roll it into a teardrop shape.

Insert a cocktail stick and leave some showing for the head to fit on.

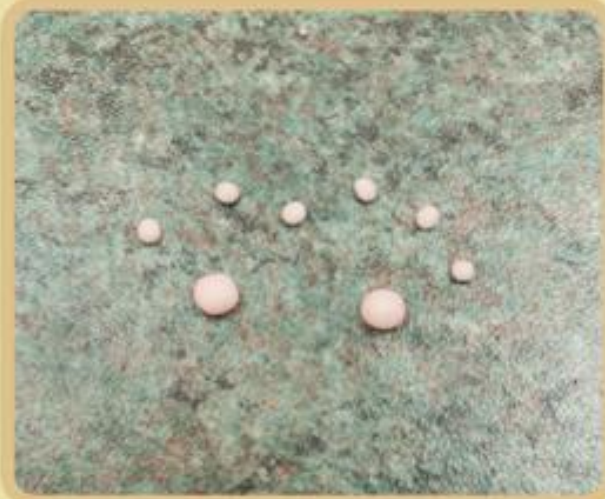


# Page 2



For the legs start with a ball of light beige sugarpaste. Roll one half into a sausage and flatten the other for the paw. Cut 2 slits, separate the toes and round the cuts off with your finger. Cut the legs to fit with your body.

# Page 3



Next take your light pink sugarpaste, roll 2 small balls, and 6 smaller ones. Attach these to the bottom of the paws with a little water and flatten them with a dresden tool or your fingers. Whilst the legs are still soft tease them into a desired position for abit more movement and character.

# Page 4



For the head start out with a ball of light beige and tease part of it into a point. Gently lower this onto the protruding cocktail stick and onto the body. Roll a small ball of light pink for the bunny nose.

# Page 3

Then you want to repeat the process all over again using an ever so slightly smaller amount. You can push them together and play around with the position of the heads and feet to make them look all snuggly :D



## Tip

Why not make them into grey hares or even moles with claws!

# Page 6



Once your happy with the position we can start on the arms. Take some more of your beige sugarpaste and roll a sausage with one end slightly fatter than the other. On the fat end make slits in the same way we did the feet.



Round the back of your figures stick the smaller bunnies arm holding the larger bunnies back with a tiny amount of water.

You will need to make four arms alltogether.



# Page 7



Stick another arm round the back to make the bunnies cuddle.

Then they need arms on the front too.

Be creative!  
You can make your smaller bunny look bashful by placing the paw near her mouth.

In this one though I am going to make them hold hands so I place it low across the body.



# Page 8



Bunnies won't look like bunnies without ears! Flatten a sausage of beige sugarpaste, and add a smaller sausage of pink on top of it. With your finger or dresden tool flatten the pink and add a line near the bottom. Cut the bottom flat and give it a pinch. To make your ears stand insert part of a cocktail stick.

# Page 9

Insert the ears on top of the bunny heads and position however you like.

## Tip

Give them floppy ears for extra cuteness. Here I was required to make hares.



# Page 10

Nearly done!

Roll out two small white teardrop shapes for fluffy tails and stick into place with a little water.



Paint on little eyes and a cute smile with a fine paintbrush and black gel colour.....

# Done!



There you have 2 cute cuddly bunnies in love!

They can be used for a wedding cake like these two were. An Anniversary, or a even a Valentines cake! Make one bunny and it would look cute on a Christening cake.

Add a Christmas hat to make a lovely Christmas cake gift for the family.
