



## Conducting a Voter Registration Drive in Pennsylvania

### Voter Registration Deadline

Applications must be received or postmarked by 30 days before Election Day.

#### Getting Started

**Training Requirement:** Pennsylvania does not require training for registration drives.

**Notification and Registration Requirements:** Pennsylvania does not have notification requirements for registration drives.

**Compensation Restrictions:** It is illegal to pay registration drive participants based on how many registrations they collect.

#### Obtaining Applications

**State Form:** Voter registration applications may be obtained from the [Secretary of State's website](#). Pennsylvania application forms are available for free through the Department of State.

**Federal Form:** Voter registration organizations are asked to use Pennsylvania specific application forms, but may also use the [federal voter registration application](#).

**Photocopying Blank Forms:** Blank applications may be photocopied and used in voter registration drives, but printed forms must meet paper quality standards set by the Secretary of State's office.

#### Handling Applications

**Incomplete Applications:** Do not fill in any missing information on a registration form unless you have permission from the applicant. Any person who assists in the completion of a registration application must sign the application and indicate the person's address.

**Photocopying Completed Applications:** As a best practice, a voter's full or partial Social Security number and/or driver's license number should not be retained.

**Submitting Completed Applications:** Completed voter registration applications must be submitted to the voter's [County Voter Registration Office](#).

The Secretary of State recommends that voter registration organizations submit completed applications as they are received.
