


December 14: Luminaria Night

A message from 12th Ward Alderman and Edgewater Neighborhood Association President John Beck

In light of the criminal activity that has occurred in Edgewater this summer I want to take this opportunity to share some thoughts with you. I can assure you that Public Safety is my top priority. I too live in this neighborhood and share your concerns. The Mayor and City Council have made Public Safety our number one priority. Within Public Safety there are four integral parts:

1. The Foundation of all our efforts is *community engagement*. You see this with the geographic policing locations, the ROCK officers who live in neighborhoods 24/7, the school resource officers in the schools, the community service officers who attend every neighborhood meeting, and the number of events we do for youth and seniors – everything from bingo to fishing and building bikes with police. We want and need to build strong lasting relationships with our citizens but specifically our youth.
2. *Investment*. Since being re-elected in 2017 we have increased our authorized force to more than 300 officers for the first time in more than a decade. We have invested nearly \$4 million into technology. Our Technology investments include:
 - A shared record management system so all police agencies are utilizing the same software
 - Tripling the number of cameras in the city
 - Purchasing mobile and stationary license plate readers
 - Purchasing gunshot detection software
 - Purchasing all new vehicles and every vehicle we purchased with the new administration includes dash cams
 - Purchasing social analytic software
 - Creating a special operations center to monitor all cameras and will soon be able to connect with all business cameras.
3. *Collaboration and focused deterrence*. We have built stronger relationships with Winnebago County Sheriff's Department, Park District Police, State Police, FBI and ATF. We have developed a Criminal Justice Coordinating council to which the mayor serves on. We also hold quarterly meetings with the most violent parolees and provide them the tools to get employment, housing and education. We also provide them a very simple but clear message – the violence must stop and we no longer tolerate violent crime.
4. *Domestic Violence (DV) and Human Trafficking Prevention*. We created the Mayor's office on DV and HT prevention - the first in the country. More than 60% of youth we arrest for violent offenses come from homes or were direct victims of DV. DV is a cycle to which we hope to stop. This month we voted on a new initiative to assist youth who are impacted by trauma from DV in their households that has been proven successful across the country (Camp Hope). We also have educated more than 250 teachers on how to recognize victims of domestic violence. We are training all Police and fire personnel on DV and what to look for. We also are leading our community's effort to create a Family Justice Center. FJC's are the Department of Justice's number one approved method for addressing DV and stopping the cycle of DV. FJC's are successful across the country most closely to home. Milwaukee has the Sojourner Family Center that is seeing tremendous results in dramatic reductions in recantation rates and far less intimate partner homicides.

We have great leadership in the Police Department. We have amazing men and women working to fight violent crime. We have an administration whose top priority is public safety and a council that time and time again re-invests in public safety.

We are making month over month progress but as with most difficult problems we will not solve this overnight. But rest assured we will not stop until we do. Thus far through August, the City's violent crime rate has dropped 17%, property crime decreased 13% and shots fired decreased 19%. Good progress but again, this is a long game. Please know we are all dedicated to fighting violent crime. Everyone in Rockford should feel safe regardless of their address.

To my neighbors in Edgewater, many of whom have lived here for decades, your vigilance and commitment to this neighborhood is paramount and deeply appreciated. I remember my mom becoming very irritated at the flight of Westside residents to the Eastside and telling us kids that we should never run away from a problem but become a part of the solution. That has stuck in my head ever since I was a child and I know it is also part of what makes me continue to fight.

DEPARTMENT REPORTING AND STATISTICS

In 2006 the department switched to reporting on the National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS). This NIBRS system will be required of all law-enforcement agencies nationwide beginning in 2021 for FBI data collection. Since the 2006 switch the Rockford Police Department has not changed how we collect or report any crime data.

The records manager for the city of Rockford Police Department is the same individual that was here in 2006, and is recognized as the state's expert on the national incident based reporting system. This staff member is conducting training for other police agencies in Illinois with the FBI to try and help other agencies understand the reporting system and make sure that they implement it correctly as they move forward toward 2021. Our statistics and reporting of the statistics are routinely audited by the FBI and have always been found to be accurate and complying with reporting standards.

Crime statistics reports are based off of police reports, generated as reports are turned in, and reflect as accurately as we can the actual crime or crimes that are being committed. **Police reports should not be confused with the 9-1-1 call log.** The 9-1-1 call log sheet simply lists what dispatchers record upon receiving a 9-1-1 call. After responding to the call, police officers generate reports and title reports with coding for what the actual crime or crimes are, which may or may not match what the dispatch has titled a call depending on the information provided to the dispatcher by a caller.

CITIZEN CONCERNS ABOUT HEARING GUNFIRE MORE OFTEN

Criminals are much more mobile, not only with cars, but also basing their movements on social media postings, such as Facebook Live and Snapchat. So even if the person being targeted is not the actual resident of a home, perhaps they are visiting or staying with the occupant temporarily, they are easier to find based on their online presence. On the whole the population is more mobile and transient than it may have been ten, twenty, thirty years ago, and criminal activity has followed suit.

WHY THE POLICE DEPARTMENT DOES NOT RESPOND TO OR REFUTE CLAIMS MADE ONLINE THAT MAY BE FALSE

Social media, blogs, and the internet in general have made it very easy for anyone to make claims or post information anytime, and from anywhere. Sometimes even well-meaning individuals pass along information that is false, misleading, or incomplete.



We cannot, nor would we ever, try and refute anything that is put on social media sites or blogs as we are bound by law to only report facts and we can only report certain facts in every case without hindering the prosecution later down the road. While the general public can post and say anything and everything they want on social media sites, we are greatly restricted and can only post what is allowed by the courts and or the state attorneys office.



Street Sweeping, Yard Refuse Pickup, Hydrant Flushing

City-wide street sweeping commenced the week of September 16th. The city is divided into 23 zones which indicate the order in which locations will be swept — 1-2 zones are cleared each week. This year, Edgewater is in zone 12, which means our neighborhood will be swept in approximately the first full week of October. This is an estimated timeframe, as weather and other factors impact the speed at which sweeping will occur.

Regardless of the timing of the official sweep by the City, it is illegal to blow, rake, or sweep yard refuse into the street. This is not only unsightly but also clogs gutters, storm drains, and puts unnecessary debris into our water system.

Yard refuse pickup continues through the fall, and occurs on the same day your trash is picked up. Refuse including leaves, grass, and sticks should be placed in compostable brown paper yard waste bags or in garbage cans that are clearly marked with an "X" on all sides. Branches may be no more than 4 inches in diameter, should be trimmed to 4 feet in length, no bundle of branches or yard waste bag or can should weigh more than 50 pounds. **Reminder:** Bagged trash and yard refuse should not be placed in the street for pickup but up on the right of way or driveway so street sweepers can get closer to the curb. Sweeping crews do not come back to sweep an area that was missed because of improperly placed garbage receptacles or parked cars.

This fall, Edgewater will get "spot-flushing" only for the hydrants that need flushing, as determined by the water division, and as such no definitive schedule can be provided.

Updates from Code Enforcement & Neighborhood Standards Division

The City of Rockford Code Enforcement Division would like to inform all residents and property owners to be aware of these property maintenance issues within the community:

Vehicles – Parking/Storage *\$50 citation*

- Total number of motor vehicles shall be limited to four (4) for each dwelling unit.
- All motor vehicles shall be operable and have current license plates displayed. Failure to correct this violation may result in the City's removal of the vehicle from the property.
- Autos, motorcycles, vans and trucks with passenger car or "B" plates must be parked on a paved surface in side and rear yards and must be parked in a driveway in front yards.
- Motor homes, campers, travel trailers and boats up to 30 ft in length, must be stored in side or rear yards on a paved surface. No motor home, camper, or travel trailer may be stored in any area located between the front property line and the street facing wall of the residential building (Side yard storage must be a minimum of 6 ft from the property line). All other trailers are prohibited. (Example: Utility Trailers, Box Type Trailers, Commercial Trailers, Car Trailers, etc.)
