Why middle school?

Ways you can participate:

Option One: Have a group of students visit your workplace. Through interactive activities let them see the career opportunities available to them and get them interested in what you do.

Option Two: Have your representative visit a school and make a presentation to students about your business. This may work best for those businesses where safety or other considerations make an on-site visit impractical.

Option Three: Host a virtual program for students in underserved areas or when bringing students into the workplace may not be an option.
