BIAS FREE POLICING

Commissioner Lee Fisher, Workgroup Chair

Two community workgroups were held in September 2017

Various community stakeholders contributed to the final submission

The final draft was submitted on October 13, 2017

Awaiting feedback on the inclusion of the CPC recommendations

CRISIS INTERVENTION

- **Commissioner Dr. Kathy Clegg**, Liaison to the Mental Health Response Advisory Committee (MHRAC)
- Multiple Community Town Halls were held and facilitated by members of the ADAMHS Board, CDP, CPC, Monitoring Team and many others
- Crisis Intervention Training was developed per the recommendations received
- Approximately 95% of officers have received the training
- Working to develop an evaluation method

DISCIPLINARY GPO

Workgroup Chair

Community Feedback was obtained at several CPC meetings

Final Draft submitted May 1, 2017

The CDP has finalized their policy and will submit to Judge Oliver in January

An Accountability Workgroup developed including, CPC, CDP, Monitoring Team, DOJ and The City to address community concerns and provide information

- Projected for February/early March

OFFICE OF PROFESSIONAL STANDARDS

- Action Plan filed with the court on December 15, 2017
- Plan was in response to noncompliance and requested by Judge Oliver
- Highlights
 - Hire independent firm by March 2018 to address backlog
 - One team will focus solely on new complaints
 - Hire OPS Administrator (position is posted on City's website)
 - Bi-weekly meetings for increased supervision and support
