# Presentation of Speakers

## **Yves le Losteque**, *Head of Sports Unit, European Commission*



**Yves Le Lostecque** is currently the Head of the Sport Unit in the European Commission. He studied public, international and European law at the University of Rennes.

He started his career in the French national Ministry responsible for Youth and Sport. He joined the Commission in 1993, where he worked as a lawyer in DG Internal Market. He was then responsible for inter-institutional issues in DG Education and Culture and served as the assistant of two director generals, Odile Quintin and Jan Trzuszczński. He also spent two years as a member of the cabinet of the Romanian Commissioner, Leonard Orban.

## **Jenny Svender**, *Research and Development Manager and expert on Gender Equality, Swedish Sports Confederation*



**Jenny Svender** is Research and Development Manager and expert on gender equality at the Swedish Sports Confederation.

She has a PhD in sport pedagogy, with gender and gender equality in sports as special research interest. In addition, she has many years of experience from practical gender equality work.

## **David Hofstetter**, *Member of the Board, European Gay and Lesbian Sport Federation, EGLSF*



**David Hofstetter** was elected as board member of the EGLSF in March 2018 and was nominated to represent EGLSF within ENGSO. Having a bachelor's degree in economics, he carried on with his studies in European Studies and Peace Research at the Universities of Fribourg (Switzerland) and Oslo (Norway). He is currently attending distance studies in International Law.

He has been active in LGBT sports since 2006; both as board member in his local club and as a participant in both the Outgames and the Eurogames.

**Orsolya Tolnay**, *Project Manager ASPIRE*



**Orsolya Tolnay** is a European sport policy specialist, an advocat for the power of sport for social change, which has been the inevitable consequence of her constant development in a variety of roles in sport (athlete, student, volunteer youth leader, coach, assistant, communication and policy officer, EU project manager).

Currently, she is Project Manager of two EU-funded projects: ASPIRE (Activity, Sport and Play for the Inclusion of Refugees in Europe) project of ENGSO and The Sound of Sport project of ASVÖ Salzburg.

She has officially been involved in ENGSO since 2011, as ENGSO Youth Committee Member (2011-2013), ENGSO Assistant (2012-2016), ENGSO Youth Communication and Partnership Officer (2016), and ENGSO Communication and Policy Officer (2016-2017).

**Shamima Aktar**, *Journalist, Womens rights activist and Basketball leader from Bangladesh*



**Shamima Aktar** is a journalist and blogger and women rights activist from Bangladesh who was forced to leave Bangladesh. She fled to Sweden in 2015.

Her journalism, blog texts and opinion-forming activities were faced with death threats and violence from Islamist extremists.

She is now working at Gotlands Sport Federation and started a basketball team named World Wide Ladies for newly arrived women in Sweden.

Shamima Aktar is awarded the Hedenius Prize and the Gotlands Integration prize this year.
