To prepare tomorrow’s leaders and world citizens, educational institutions must remain accessible for today’s young people. Iowa State University is committed to fulfilling its mission as a land-grant institution to ensure that students can pursue their educational goals and dreams – and prepare for meaningful careers in which they can help solve the world’s greatest problems.

To do this, the university is asking the Iowa State family to come together in support of *Moving Students Forward*, a five-year initiative to raise \$150 million for scholarships and other student support. Scholarships not only make the difference in enabling young people of all backgrounds and abilities to attend Iowa State, but they also ensure that once here, students are able to engage to their fullest potential – excelling in the classroom and participating in organizations and activities that build skills, character and confidence.

Only 25 percent of current Iowa State students receive private scholarship assistance. *Moving Students Forward* seeks to raise that number substantially through new gifts for student support, including flexible scholarship funds, need- and merit-based scholarships, support for international and experiential learning, and graduate scholarships and fellowships.

“I am the first in my family to go to college, and I am paying for my own education. I work during the school year part time, and when school is not in session, I work 40 or more hours a week in my hometown at a fast-food restaurant. It is because of the scholarships I receive that I am able to attend Iowa State. Understanding Design on a Global Scale

Clark Colby took part in an 18-day China program in architecture and landscape architecture and a four-month internship at a firm in Beijing. A Doris Piper Lamberson International Study Scholarship helped make his study abroad experiences possible. Said Colby, “China is an amazing place to study architecture. It is full of ancient structures juxtaposed with contemporary architectural wonders. The impact of urbanization in Beijing, a city of more than 19 million people, must be witnessed to be understood, and studying in China opens one’s eyes to how, in order to responsibly shape our small planet, we must understand our part in this global community. Without scholarship support, my experiences in China would have been out of the question.”



Scholarships for study abroad are especially vital, enabling students to become responsible global citizens, to understand global practice, and to learn how their field of study can help solve some of the world’s most challenging issues – while experiencing the unique learning that occurs only through immersion in another culture.
