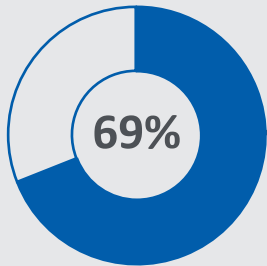
**159** men received support and housing at the Beacon House Men's Residence.



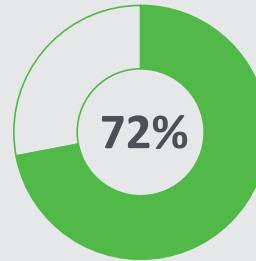
**102** women were supported at the Virginia & David Baldwin Women's Residence.

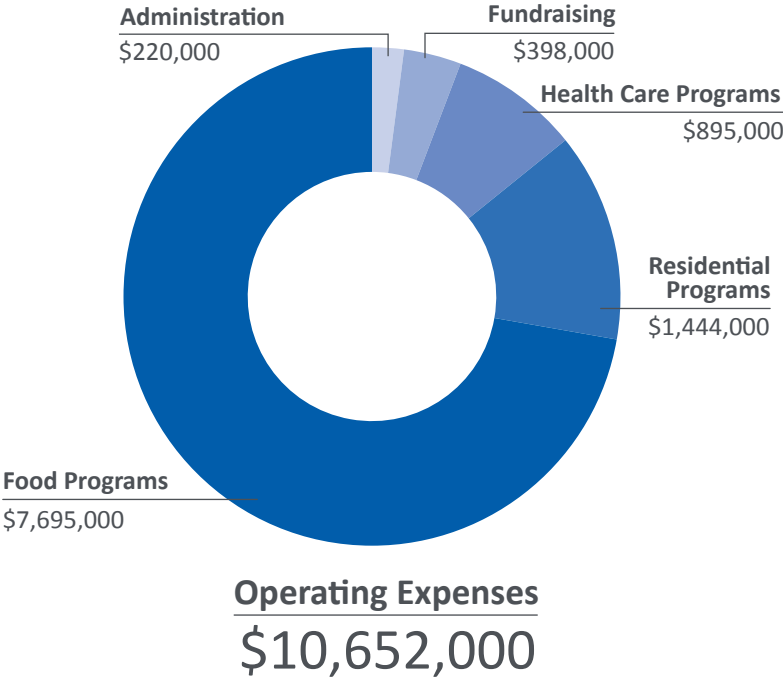
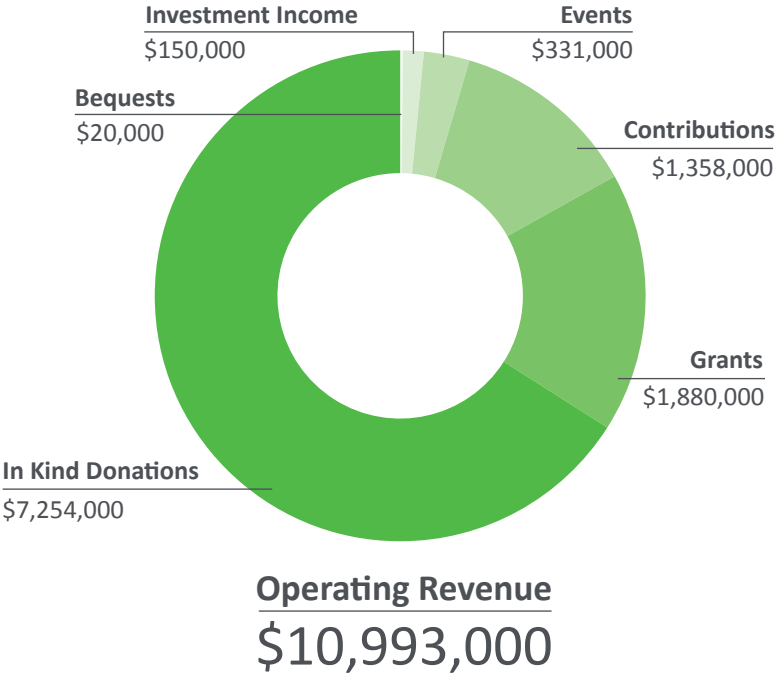
