Did you know...about Diabetes...

*Approx. 1 in 500 school students have Type 1 Diabetes

*Approx. 10% of diabetes in NZ are Type 1

Comparison of type 1 and 2 diabetes		
Feature	Type 1 diabetes	Type 2 diabetes
Onset	Sudden	Gradual
Age at onset	Any age (mostly young)	Mostly in adults
Body habitus	Thin or normal	Often obese
Ketoacidosis	Common	Rare
Autoantibodies	Usually present	Absent
Endogenous insulin	Low or absent	Normal, decreased or increased
Concordance in identical twins	50%	90%
Prevalence	Less prevalent	More prevalent - 90 to 95% of U.S. diabetics

This annual event dates back to 1919 and was traditionally held on 11th November (Armistice Day) to celebrate the end of World War 1. It is now held on the Saturday closest to this date to allow as many parents as possible to assist with the organisation. There is keen competition between the six schools for the various trophies and **as the Saturday is considered a school day, all children are expected to attend and we mark the roll as usual.** If the event is cancelled, it will NOT be run on Monday. The main relay and shield events will be held on the Friday following the cancellation.

You will be either texted or emailed if the event is cancelled.

Dovedale will be running the **Long Jump.**

We will require parents to help throughout the day. We try to schedule on as many parents as possible throughout the day, so that everyone has the chance to help, watch and cheer on their children as well. This is an easy job. Please fill in the form below and return it to school as soon as possible. We will let you know your rostered time slot.

Age Groups students will be grouped according to areas on the day as follows:

5 year olds, Junior A = 6-7 years, Junior B = 8-9 years, Intermediate = 10 -11 years, Senior = 12 years +
