Mr. Armstrong is an Antiterrorism Officer with the Training and Doctrine Command [TRADOC] assigned to the Maneuver Center of Excellence [MCoE] at Fort Benning, GA.

The America PrepareAthon! is a campaign sponsored by the Department of Defense [DoD] twice a year – in spring and fall- to build and sustain national preparedness by identifying and learning about the hazards people face in their everyday lives. The Department of Defense depends on the strength and readiness of its military and civilian workforce. According to the DoD, one of its top priorities is focusing on the well-being and safety of each member of our workforce and their families so that the U.S. can continue to be safeguarded. From the DoD's perspective, national preparedness and military readiness are synonymous.

The Commanding General of the Maneuver Center of Excellence at Fort Benning, was recognized for this remarkably success.
