Criteria for Active Membership

Active membership shall be limited to attorneys at law who:

- (a) are admitted to practice before the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania;
- (b) are members of the Allegheny County Bar Association who have their primary office located in Allegheny County;
- (c) regularly appear in the litigation of a substantial number of civil cases in which a jury trial is either requested or eventually conducted in the Court of Common Pleas of Allegheny County and/or the United States Court for the Western District of Pennsylvania;
- (d) have been engaged principally in civil trial practice for a period of at least five (5) years;
- (e) have completed at least three (3) civil trials to jury verdict; and
- (f) have had at least twenty (20) full days of civil jury trial. The following may be substituted for up to nine (9) civil jury trial days:
 - i) a criminal jury trial or non-jury civil trial or other comparable evidentiary proceeding before a judge or arbitrator (for example, a preliminary injunction hearing or arbitration, but not an administrative or family law hearing) of at least two (2) days duration which proceeding involves direct and cross examination of witnesses, an opening statement and/or closing argument, and an adjudication on the central issue of the case (as opposed to, for example, decisions on procedural or collateral issues);
 - ii) one (1) day of a qualifying proceeding under sub-section i) above shall equal one (1) civil jury trial day.

The trial experience in (e) and (f) is not required to have taken place in Allegheny County or the Western District of Pennsylvania. A trial day includes procedures such as jury selection, argument on evidentiary motions (such as motions in limine and motions relating to expert testimony), motions after jury selection, opening and closing statements and taking testimony.
