On 26 December 2018, the Government of Japan announced its withdrawal from the International Convention on the Regulation of Whaling (ICRW) and the International Whaling Commission (IWC) [Statement by Chief Cabinet Secretary]. The withdrawal enters into effect on 30 June 2019 and Japan will resume the commercial whaling from 1 July 2019.
