### Join us for this year's Annual Gathering

A crucial part of our common faith and practice as American Baptists are the stories of the Bible. Preceding our Gathering will be two other events that focus on Storytelling... Dr. Mike Graves, renowned homiletician, will be leading a workshop on Narrative preaching and storytelling. This workshop is not just for preachers but for deacons, Sunday school teachers and anyone else who finds themselves called upon to relate the gospel in a meaningful way.

And then there is the annual Clergy Dinner (open to all) where we will see the story come alive through photos. Story-telling after all involves all of our senses, and National Geographic photographer, Ken Jenkins, tells the story in a unique way through his work.

We will be gathering at First Baptist of Fort Morgan because churches in smaller communities are a vital part of our storyline. We will have the opportunity to see how God is at work in Fort Morgan and in the many other small communities our member congregations serve.

So, make plans now to join us for this powerful event. We look forward to seeing and being with you at this, our annual reunion of the extended family of ABCRM.



### **Gardens of Divine Hope Church Community Gardens**

Gardens of Divine Hope Church had the honor of receiving a Curtis Park Grant for community service. The significance of this grant involved working with schools and churches in developing community gardens and to harvest these gardens with the intention of giving the produce to the hungry and most needy in the schools, churches and communities.

As we progressed through the process, we contributed not only in providing soil nutrients, seeds and tools for the community gardens but we actually become very involved in the construction, set-up, and design of the gardens. The whole purpose of this grant was to implement Community Involvement. This was accomplished not only through collaborating with different schools and churches, but it was promoted through our churches attendance at numerous PTA meetings, conferences, and special meetings to set up agendas and organizational charts for construction and planting of the gardens. I, as pastor, was asked to be on three boards regarding the gardening projects.

The community gardens provide a wonderful way for people to work together, get to know each other, and build relationships. It is also a time for children to learn to plant and to understand God's creation as he has offered this gift. Denver Urban Gardens and Slow Kitchen Foods collaborated with us as well.

Because of attendance at numerous PTA meetings, we were able to introduce the church to many people. As a result, we had attendance at our Easter services this year from families who didn't have a church, some who hadn't been inside a church before, and hadn't been introduced to the gospel at all.





  Park Baptist Church, Charlotte, NC, he served as the
  senior spiritual educator of a 2100-member ecumenical church (2010-13).
- Four years ago, Andrew was called to join the staff of Calvary Baptist Church working with his friend, the Reverend Anne Scalfaro and the dear folks of Calvary.
