Will you give to One Great Hour?

Beating the Drought in San Mateo County, California



Among those affected by one of California's worst droughts in the past century is Redwood Glen, an independently owned American Baptist-affiliated camp that has been serving American Baptists and nonprofit organizations for 57 years.

Nestled among the redwoods of the scenic coastal Santa Cruz Mountains in San Mateo County, approximately 30 miles south of San Francisco, Redwood Glen offers children and youth the type of wholesome experiences that create lifetime memories.

"Our multi-day resident camps provide a safe environment for young people to build relationships with others and with God," says Redwood Glen Executive Director Larry Rice. "They are instructed in God's Word, and have a funtime experiencing true Christian community. Games, activities, singing, hiking, swimming, campfire and creekstomping are some of the activities. In small cabin groups, our trained volunteer staff and counselors live out the love of


> Christ and provide support as faith decisions are considered and made."

This past summer, 289 American Baptist-affiliated campers and volunteers participated in six sponsored-program camps for ages 7 to 18. Twenty-six American Baptist-affiliated groups, serving 983 individuals, utilized Redwood Glen in 2013. The groups ranged from five individuals for a staff retreat to 125 persons for church camping.

Redwood Glen had been receiving water from the adjacent county-owned Memorial Park as well as nearby Pescadero Creek. Then, because of the drought, the county informed the supply would be discontinued. Redwood Glen entered crisis

"We had to close our doors for a bit and scramble to have water trucked in," says Rice. Our water costs increased from \$6,000 a year to \$6,500 per week during the summer."

In August, American Baptist Home Mission Societies (ABHMS), on behalf of American Baptist Churches USA, awarded a \$10,000 One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS) Domestic Emergency Disaster Grant to Redwood Glen. The camp is now investing in digging a well and installing a filtration system so it can become self-sufficient. The goal is to gain approval for the well and access to water by June 30, 2015. The estimated cost is \$65,000.

"Here in the metropolis of the San Francisco Bay Area and Silicon Valley, Redwood Glen is only an hour's drive away, yet worlds apart," Rice says. "We provide a place where people can get away from the hectic, frantic pace of the commuter and the computer to step into the calm, peaceful beauty of God's creation. Redwood Glen is that rare place that has not been taken over by the cement jungle, but is rather established in the firm foundation of God, his love for us and the peace he provides for each of us."

When you give to OGHS, individuals of all ages are ensured a beautiful Christian venue in which to conduct business, learn or have fun.

Dear Sisters and Brothers of ABCRM,

When I was notified recently of your very generous mission support for Annie and me here in Bangkok, the word "trust fund" came to mind. It came not in the traditional way we tend to understand "trust funds". Instead, it came to me as a description or picture of your most recent mission support. Let me try to draw this picture for you . . .

I have been to the Rocky Mountains a handful of times in my life. I have driven over them a couple times as well. They are God's beautiful creation! I have met a few people from churches in the Rocky Mountain region as well as some of the regional staff. They too are God's beautiful creation! But I don't live there. I don't work there. And I don't serve in a local church or in the regional office there. So I really don't



know what is happening on a daily basis, but I completely <u>trust</u> that the Body of Christ represented in the region is alive, growing, engaging the local communities at some level and bringing change. I also <u>trust</u> that the local churches are prayerfully and financially supportive of mission in the region and throughout the world. Not being there, I can only <u>trust</u> that there are funds to represent Christ locally and globally.

As a representative of Christ serving globally for almost 21 years in Bangkok, Thailand I can tell you that both <u>trust</u> and <u>funds</u> are needed. The churches in general seem more than willing to <u>trust</u> us with the Lord's work in Bangkok. We can almost hear the cheers of encouragement that come through the prayers offered on our behalf <u>trusting</u> that the Lord will watch over us, protect us, keep us safe and that we will be the fruit of our labor in ministry. Many have written personal notes saying, "Thank you for doing what we cannot do." We have been encouraged by many from the churches that the ministry of rescue and restoration with exploited women, both Thai and internationally trafficked women, is an important and transformational ministry that needs to happen and the churches are glad to <u>trust</u> us with it as per the Lord's calling on our lives as global workers. But while most of the churches trust, not that many fund that trust.

Not so with you, dear friends of the Rocky Mountain Region!!

Thank you for <u>trusting</u> and <u>funding</u> Christ's work in and through us among the exploited here in Bangkok! Your very generous mission support of us really makes a difference. <u>Trust</u> alone won't keep us on the field, but <u>trust</u> and <u>funds</u> will and that is what you have done! I pray that as your <u>trust</u> and <u>funding</u> for all that Christ is doing globally through us and other servants continues and increases, so will your own <u>trust</u> and <u>funding</u> for the region and the local churches continue and increase.


