About the **PROGRAM MODEL**







21st Century Community Learning Centers is a U.S. Department of Education program, administered by the states, supporting out-of-school time learning opportunities for students in high-poverty, low-performing areas. The lowa Department of Education administers 21CCLC funding in lowa through grant competitions. 21CCLC programs focus on academic support (helping students meet state and local standards in core academic subjects), academic enrichment (providing activities that complement learning from the school day), and parent engagement (offering literacy and educational services to the families of participating students). Technical assistance and support for the 21 CCLC programs in Iowa is provided by the Iowa Afterschool Alliance.


