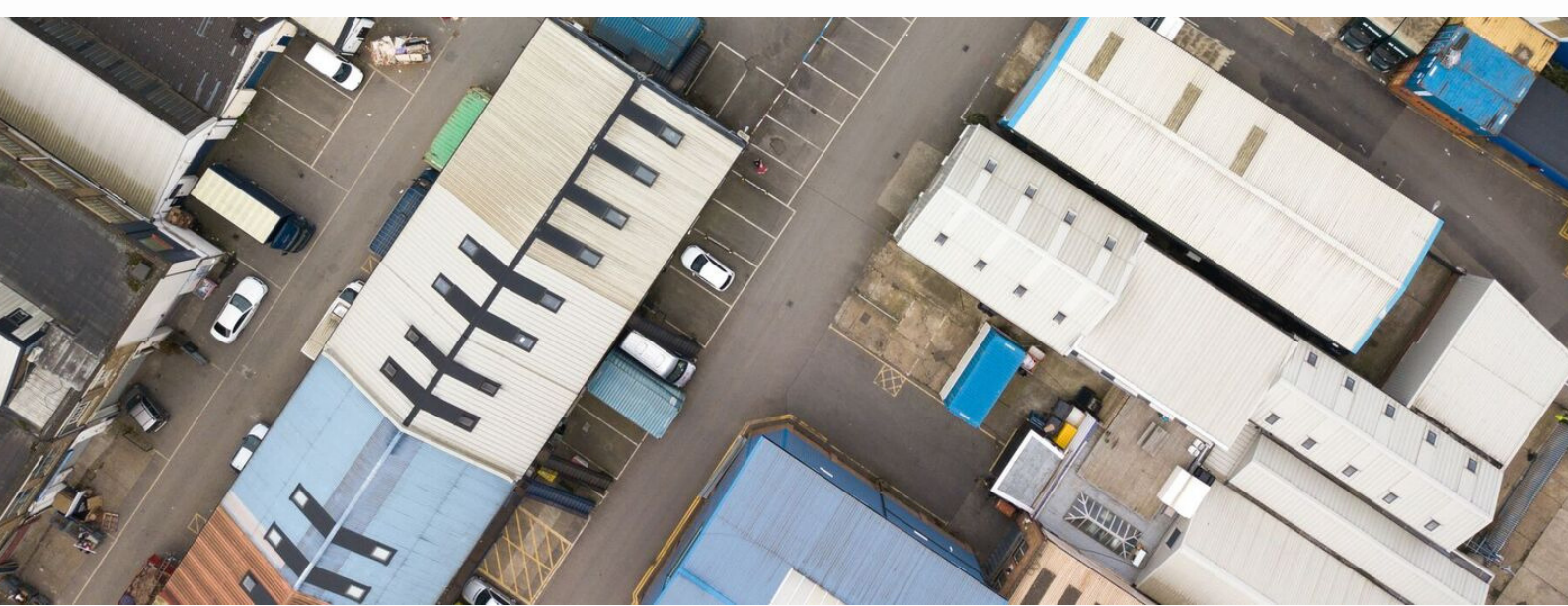


# GBP NEWSLETTER
