

LETTERING & AWARDS POLICY

The Memorial High School Program has a Lettering and Awards Policy that follows guidelines set forth in the UIL Constitution and Contest Rules Handbook and the Spring Branch ISD Athletic Handbook.

To be eligible to earn a varsity letter in the Memorial High School Basketball Program, a player must:

1. Compete on the varsity level and complete the season in good standing. An injured player who remains involved with the team until the completion of the season is considered as having completed the season. A player who is removed from the team for disciplinary reasons at any time during the season will not letter.
2. Be a part of the varsity team for at least half the season and suit up for at least 6 of the district games.
3. Remain academically eligible to participate throughout the entire basketball season. The season officially begins with the first practice of the season and ends with the last contest of the season played by the team – including playoffs.
4. Adhere to school and team expectations, rules, policies and guidelines. Violation of these expectations, rules and guidelines may mitigate forfeiture of the varsity letter by the athlete.
5. Be an active member of the team. This is not measured in games or minutes, but rather by the commitment a player demonstrates to the team in practice and competition on and off the court.

To be eligible to earn a sub-varsity letter in the Memorial High School Basketball Program, a player must:

1. Compete on the sub-varsity level and complete the season in the good standing. An injured player who remains involved with the team until the completion of the season is considered as having completed the season. A player who is removed from the team for disciplinary reasons at any time during the season will not receive a certificate.
2. Remain academically eligible to participate throughout the entire basketball season. The season officially begins with the first practice of the season and ends with the last contest of the season played by the team – including play-offs.
3. Adhere to school and team expectations, rules, policies and guidelines. Violation of these expectations, rules and guidelines may mitigate forfeiture of the sub-varsity letter by the athlete.
4. Be an active member of the team. This is not measured in games or minutes, but rather by the commitment a player demonstrates to the team in practice and competition on and off the court.

In general, we expect all our varsity and sub-varsity players to letter because we believe that they will all remain academically eligible, participate to the fullest in practice and head-to-head competition and that they will conduct themselves in a manner in which the community, Memorial High School and our program, in particular, can take pride.
