First ever National Digital Media Investigator's Conference announced! Collaboration between The College of Policing and The Investigator

The Investigator and the College of Policing are jointly hosting the first ever National Digital Media Investigator's Conference aimed at promoting and supporting the role of the DMI in the criminal investigation process.

This unique two day event will bring together DMIs from across the UK to debate current issues and best practice and to network and forge new links with their colleagues.

The past six years have seen the development of the DMI role in the criminal investigation process and in many forces DMIs now play an integral part in formulating and shaping the digital strategy, responding on both an operational and strategic level.

Both the College of Policing and The Investigator have been working to provide training and CPD to support the DMI role and the conference marks the continuation of this commitment.

The College of Policing has served as a national conduit for DMIs and has hosted a number of training courses, events and networking opportunities. The College is launching the new DMI programme which will be available as a licenced programme to select forces/organisations.

The Investigator has for the past two years been working with DMCs and DMIs in each region to host a number of Digital Media Investigation conferences and workshops, again aimed at supporting and promoting the role.

About the Conference

Our two day event is open to all UK DMIs and will include a number of presentations, workshops around current themes/issues. It will also provide DMIs with the opportunity to share their own notable practice by presenting case studies based on their own personal experiences.
