## Lesson 7 **Human Behavior**

All the words in this lesson may be associated with human behavior.

affectionate ADJ. loving, fond (Paul gave his aunt an affectionate hug.)

agreeable ADJ. willing; ready to go along with (Our teacher was agreeable to postponing the test.)

ambitious ADJ. eager to achieve or excel (The after-school math workshop is for ambitious students.)

ardent ADJ. expressing intense feeling; passionate (The Conservation Club wrote an ardent letter in support of the recycling program.)

authoritative ADJ. acting as if in command (With an authoritative manner, William directed the younger students to their classes on the first day of school.)

**barbaric** ADJ. uncivilized; rude (I like to tease my brother about his *barbaric* table manners.)

candid ADJ. frank; honest (Don't try to spare my feelings, just give me your candid opinion of these poems.)

**confident** ADJ. sure of oneself (Because she had worked hard, Meghan felt *confident* before the track meet.)

**considerate** ADJ. concerned about the feelings of others; kind (It is not *considerate* to talk and laugh loudly in the library.)

**cooperative** ADJ. willing to work together (Because of our *cooperative* attitude, our group had few disagreements during the project.)

**courtly** ADJ. elegant; very polite (Max gave Latasha a *courtly* bow when he invited her to the prom.)

**diplomatic** ADJ. avoiding hurting others; tactful (Josh tried to think of a *diplomatic* way to tell his mother he did not like the shirt.)

disagreeable ADJ. unpleasant; unfriendly (My friends tell me to go to bed on time because I am very disagreeable when I am tired.)

distracted ADJ. having one's attention drawn away (Ben lost his place in his book when he was distracted by sirens in the street.)

enthusiastic ADJ. very eager; wholehearted (The enthusiastic applause showed that the audience had enjoyed the concert.)

fretful ADJ. irritable; cranky (Babies often become fretful when they are hungry.)
haughty ADJ. overly proud or snobbish (The winner's haughty attitude made her
unpopular with the other swimmers.)

**Impeccable** ADJ. flawless (There was not a single wrong note in Mike's *impeccable* performance at the concert.)

**preoccupied** ADJ. not paying attention because one is lost in thought (Wendy is preoccupied with worry because her puppy is sick.)

**restless** ADJ. unable to keep still (Hoping the play would be over soon, the *restless* child squirmed in her seat.)
